#### Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



How determined are you? You'd have to go a long way to beat the dedication of Robert Stevens. In order to raise money for the private school his daughter attends, the Minneapolis hospital executive donned four layers of long underwear, heavy boots and a down coat before camping out on the roof of a local coffee

shop. With a sign that read, "Get Me Off The Roof", Stevens vowed not to come down until he had raised \$100,000. A weekend storm dumped nearly two feet of snow in some areas near the Twin Cities, and the inflatable roof of the Minnesota Viking's stadium collapsed on Sunday. But Stevens remained undeterred as he slept inside a tent surrounded by hay bales, swaddled in a double-insulated sleeping bag as he listened to the winds whip off Lake Minnetonka a block away. Stevens did admit that he hoped the rest of the money would come fast. "I think I've crossed the line into insanity," he said.

Someone once said, "The question isn't who is going to let me; it's who is going to stop me." With a clearly identified objective, strong will to achieve a goal, an intelligent plan of action -- and, of course, help from the Almighty -- there's nothing that can stop one with true determination.

#### Parshas Vayechi Genesis 47:28 -- 50:26

The final portion of the first book of the Torah describes Jacob's actions immediately preceding his death in Egypt. Jacob makes Joseph swear to bury him in the land of Israel, and then gives Joseph's two sons, Menashe and Ephraim, a special blessing. Notwithstanding Joseph's protest, Jacob insists on giving the younger Ephraim the right-hand position of primacy during the blessing (is this the origin of 'my right-hand man'?).

Jacob then proceeds to give each of his other sons their individual blessings in accordance with their own unique character traits and life purpose. Jacob passes away at the age of 147. He then is brought by his sons and accompanied by a great procession of Egyptian royalty to the land of Israel where he is buried in M'aras HaMachpelah (The Tomb of the Patriarchs). Upon return to Egypt, Joseph's brothers fear that he will finally take revenge now that their father is dead. However, Joseph reassures them that he bears no hard feelings. The portion concludes with Joseph's death and the Jewish people's promise to carry his bones with them to Israel when they are finally redeemed.

#### Rabbinical Ruminations



He seemed like Superman, able to guide jumbo jets through perilous skies and tiny tubes through blocked arteries. As a cardiologist and United Airlines captain, William Hamman taught doctors and pilots ways to keep hearts and planes from crashing. He shared millions in grants, had university and hospital posts, and bragged of work for prestigious medical groups. Last spring he led a

teamwork training session at a cardiology convention.

But it turns out Hamman isn't a cardiologist or even a doctor. Though his pilot qualifications do not appear to be in question, it was recently discovered that he attended medical school for a few years but withdrew and didn't graduate. Hamman had no medical residency, fellowship, doctoral degree or the 15 years of clinical experience he claimed. "Dr." Hamman resigned in June as an educator and researcher at a Michigan hospital after a credentials check revealed discrepancies. After fessing up, Hamman asked the AMA and a cardiology conferencegroup to let him continue, saying, "the work is the work." They decided that a lie is a lie.

Of all types of honesty, perhaps the most important is self-honesty. A successful journey in life requires rigorous self-honesty. However, our subjectivity and pride make it extremely difficult -- if not impossible -- to render proper judgments in issues of great importance. A trusted spiritual guide or mentor can be of great help in obtaining a realistic assessment of ourselves and decisions we seek to make. Ethics of the Fathers teaches us: accept for yourself a rabbi/mentor. Objectivity based upon wise and caring counsel can make all the difference.
