





Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as *'The Ari'*. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



Memphis basketball coach Josh Pastner admitted to having committed a minor NCAA violation in early April, but in an odd twist he blamed the mishap on an unlikely culprit: his wife. Pastner

inadvertently tweeted the name of a prized recruit in the Class of '12 on Memphis basketball's official Twitter account, a violation of NCAA protocol. Pastner explained the errant tweet as a result of being distracted by the pressures of recruiting, filling a vacancy on his staff -- and badgering from his pregnant wife -- and typed the name in Twitter instead of Google.

"My wife was yelling at me because I was on the phone too loud. I was waking (the couple's infant daughter) up and waking my wife up because I had the TV on. She was complaining that I not only woke my daughter up, but I also woke the baby inside her up because she's pregnant. So I was waking everybody up, I was getting yelled at and on top of that I was thinking, 'What's going on with recruiting?' and 'Who am I going to hire?' and I made a mistake."

The Torah (Gen.2:18) describes a wife as a man's "aizer kinegdo" (helpmate against him). The commentaries wrestle with the apparent contradiction of "helpmate against him." The explanation offered is that if the husband is worthy, his wife will help him to reach his potential. If he is misdirected and misbehaving, she will be against him. Coach Pastner shouldn't be in much trouble with the NCAA for the minor self-reported infraction. At home, however, his "aizer kinegdo" may have him still sleeping on the couch

Parshas Emor - Leviticus. 21:1 - 24:23



Following the command in last week's portion to be sanctified and holy, Parshas Emor begins by discussing various laws directed specifically to the Kohanim and the Kohen Gadol (High Priest). Included is the command for the Kohen to refrain from becoming

ritually impure through contact with a dead body (except for close relatives) and increased restrictions on whom they may marry. G-d requires those with

greater spiritual responsibilities to maintain a higher standard of spiritual purity. Parshas Emor contains two of the most significant mitzvos in the entire Torah; to always be mindful of not desecrating G-d's name, and on the contrary, to sanctify Him at all costs.

The Torah goes on to discuss the festivals of the year - Pesach, Shavous, Rosh Hashana, Yom Kippur, Succos and Shemini Atzeres. The festivals, including Shabbos, are referred to as moadim, appointed times; they are special days when Jews 'meet', as it were, with G-d. The festivals interrupt our ordinary weekday activities and inspire us to rededicate ourselves to those ideals that life is really about. Later, two mitzvos in the Mishkan are stated: the daily lighting of the menorah and the display of the *lechem hapanim* (showbread). The portion concludes with the horrible incident of a man who cursed G-d's name.

Rabbinic Ruminations



Ten years ago last week the Thiers Necklace, left to the French nation in 1881 by the widow of the French president, was worth \$250,000 when it was first placed in the Louvre. The necklace, made of 145 finely graded

rose pink pearls, lay in the Louvre for years. When authorities became aware of its condition, the pearls were dull, dirty looking and practically valueless. The chief gem experts of Europe were consulted. Some advised skinning the pearls -- peeling their outer layers, like one would peel an onion. But such an operation was extremely delicate and hazardous and would reduce the size of the pearls.

The French government decided against that process, and chose the alternative of finding some young woman whose constitution was such to make her a 'pearl mother.' Out of the dozens of applicants for the honor, Mlle. Grueze, a well known star of the French stage, was chosen. And so, for several months out of the year, the actress wore them. Whenever she wore them, delegates of the Louvre were close by, watching. At night, she would hand them to the watchmen, and have them returned to her the next morning. It took many years, but under Mlle. Grueze's watch and care, the Thiers Necklace was restored to its original health and beauty.

A pearl, of organic origin, draws life from human

contact. If an inanimate object such as a pearl can be revitalized by human contact, imagine how far a kind word or a simple gesture can go to nourish a living, breathing entity such as a human being. In Ethics of the Fathers (1:15), Shamai taught, "Greet every person with a smiling and warm face!" Like a pearl, we all draw life from warm human contact.

Question: What is Havdalah?

Answer: The end of Shabbos calls for a special declaration, Havdalah, which identifies Shabbos as a day distinct from the rest of the week. Havdalah means 'separation' or 'distinction.' It is said twice, once during the Saturday night Amidah and once again over a cup of wine. Like Kiddush, Havdalah is a familiar home ceremony. Although wine (or grape juice) is the preferred beverage for the ceremony. Havdalah may be said over other "important liquids" (chamar medinah). In the view of many authorities, this includes beer, milk, coffee, tea and fruit juice. Havdalah may be said either while seated or standing. The Havdalah ceremony contains the following components: a) introductory verses, b) a blessing for wine, c) a blessing for spices, d) a blessing for light, and e) the Haydalah blessing, which is the basic prayer of the mitzvah.


