

Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason Parshas Shemini April 2, 2016

"The Eagle-Eyed Drone Catcher"

Rogue drone operators are rapidly becoming a national nuisance. In recent days, drones -- aircraft without human pilots aboard -- have smuggled drugs into an Ohio prison, smashed against a Cincinnati skyscraper, impeded efforts to fight wildfires in California and nearly collided with three airliners over New York City. The Department of Homeland Security said it had recorded more than 500 incidents since 2012 in which rogue drones hovered over "sensitive sites and critical installations," such as military bases and nuclear plants. In one well-publicized case, a drone crashed onto the White House grounds. The US military is ramping up its anti-drone efforts, having announced plans to build a laser weapon to shoot down drones.

While American authorities have struggled to stay ahead of the technology, police in Holland are touting a unique anti-drone weapon – a specially trained eagle. For hundreds of years in the skies over Asia, people have used eagles to hunt down prey. That tradition has been in decline for decades, but now the bird's keen eyesight, powerful talons and lethal hunting instincts are being used to take out intrusive drones. A Dutch National Police spokesman said about the trained eagle, "It's a low-tech solution to a high-tech problem." Watch this video (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KNE57orePJE) which shows an eagle swooping to grasp a small commercial drone in its talons before landing with its "prey."

The anti-drone eagle is just one example in a long history of animals and wildlife in the service of man. While Jewish law protects the ethical treatment of animals, Judaism also maintains that animals are meant to serve mankind, as it says: "Let man dominate the fish, birds and animals" (Genesis 1:26). There is a clear hierarchy of creation, with man at the pinnacle. May G-d, the Source of all blessings, give man the wisdom to use His world -- including the animal kingdom -- in a proper fashion.

Parshas Shemini Leviticus 9:1 - 11:47

This week's Torah portion begins by discussing the events which occurred on the eighth and final day of the inauguration service of the Mishkan. After months of preparation, Aaron and his sons are finally installed as Kohanim in an elaborate service. Aaron blesses the people, and the entire nation rejoices as G-d's presence rests upon them. However, the excitement comes to an abrupt halt as Aaron's two eldest sons, Nadav and Avihu, are consumed by a heavenly fire in the Mishkan while innovating an offering of incense on the altar. This incident stresses the need to perform the commandments only as G-d directed. Later, Moses consoles Aaron, who grieves in silence.

Have you ever wondered where the laws of kosher food come from? Parshas Shemini concludes with a listing of the kosher and non-kosher animals. The identifying signs of a kosher animal are that it has split hooves and chews, regurgitates and re-chews its food. A kosher fish is one that has both fins and scales. All birds not included in the list of forbidden fowl are permitted. However, today the identity of these non-kosher birds is doubtful. Therefore, we're forbidden to eat any species of bird unless there is a well-established tradition that it is kosher. The Torah forbids all types of insects except for four

species of locusts. Chocolate-covered grasshoppers, anyone? The laws of kashrut help us to be distinct and holy -- like G-d, Himself.

Rabbinic Ruminations

Many charities operating in the United States and elsewhere are struggling and competing for limited donations. Eliciting empathy and support has never been easy, particularly for lesser-known charities. To increase fundraising, charities often invest in advertising and public relations to build awareness. However, could there be a more cost-effective approach to enhance fund-raising? New research suggests a highly unusual approach to promote people's empathic responses and encourage charitable donations: Having people touch rough sandpaper.

According to a new study in the Journal of Consumer Psychology (Wang et al., 2016), the authors find that touching a rough surface may enhance individuals' empathic responses. Dr. Chen Wang, the study's first author, said: "We found that when people were experiencing mild discomfort as a result of touching a rough surface, they were more aware of discomfort in their immediate environment. They could better empathize with individuals who were suffering." What type of strategy does this finding suggest? Fundraisers could, perhaps, incorporate a little roughness into their outreach materials, such as wrapping a clipboard with sandpaper or including certain roughly-textured material in a direct-mail brochure. Such a tactile approach, study authors suggest, could also effectively increase empathy levels and thus ultimately enhance helping likelihood and donation rates.

Moses, our greatest leader, encountered a burning bush. As he stood at the site trying to understand what was going on, G-d told him to remove his shoes. Why? G-d asked Moses to remove his shoes to teach Moses to experience the pain caused by the small stones under his feet. A leader must empathize with people even when their problems appear to be insignificant. A Jew must appreciate the pain of another and know how to "remove his shoes", feel the pebbles, and help to the best of his or her ability.
