YIZKOR

Just as a reminder, this upcoming Saturday is the last day of Passover, and we will be conducting Yizkor services at our Shabbat morning services. For those who will be lighting Yahrzeit candles, a brief reminder of the procedure may be helpful. The last days of Passover, which are Yom Tovim, begin on Thursday night. That means that Yahrzeit candles would normally be kindled on Friday night. But because Friday night is Shabbat, and it is forbidden to create a new flame on Shabbat, we follow a specific procedure. The Yizkor candle should be lit from an existing flame, such as the pilot light of a gas stove, or an already lit candle. Yahrzeit candles, which can be purchased in most supermarkets, are designed to burn more than 24 hours so they will remain burning into the next day and many people light another yahrzeit candle prior to sundown on Thursday to use for just this purpose. The yahrzeit candle should be lit prior to lighting Shabbat candles on Friday night, since the lighting of Shabbat candles initiates Shabbat and no flame may be lit after that until Shabbat ends. There are no prescribed prayers to recite when one lights a yahrzeit candle.
