Parshas Korach

July 9, 2016

"Making Childhood Memories"

While photographing the Route 66 Bridge last week, a St. Louis Post-Dispatch photographer found a 1980 Eureka High School men's class ring half-buried in the mud of the Meramec River. Within 24 hours, more than 300 people had shared on Facebook the story of the lost ring, bearing the initials "LFF". Who was "LFF", and how did he lose his ring? After graduating from Eureka High School in 1980, Leo Franklin Fritz joined his friends on the banks of the Meramec River -- a place they called Reid Raise -- for a bonfire. The 17-year-old swam, joked with friends and partook in some underage drinking. "The law shows up, everybody takes off running out through the woods, and when I got to the top of the road, my (class) ring was gone," Leo said. For 36 years, the ring was lost to the Meramec River.

This past Friday at Eureka High School, after years of telling his children and grandchildren about the ring he'd lost, "LFF" (Leo) was reunited with his long-lost class ring. "I had eight brothers and sisters, and my mom and dad couldn't afford stuff like this," Leo said. "When I lost it, it was a big blow to us. I looked for this ring for months after that. Everybody down there looked for it." Leo doesn't remember how much the ring cost, but he does remember how much he worked to pay for it. A summer of odd jobs, cutting grass and pulling weeds around town. Leo even bought a metal detector to try to find the ring. Three years ago, an electrical fire burned Leo's home to the ground. Trying to get out of the house, he and his wife were only able to grab one thing, his father's small grandfather clock. "That's the only memory we've got of our childhood," he said. "Now I've got this (the ring)."

Fortunate is one whose childhood memories are those of peace, harmony and Jewish values. If we provide our children a Jewish education when they are young, their minds will literally be shaped by that knowledge. Understanding of the Torah will become ingrained and Judaism's values will become second nature. What they absorb at that age will not only be better-remembered information. It will shape them as individuals for the rest of their lives, providing them with rich, wonderful memories of childhood.

Parshas Korach Numbers 16:1 - 18:32

This week's Torah portion begins with the infamous rebellion led by Korach against his cousins, Moses and Aaron, claiming that the two of them had usurped power from the rest of the Jewish people. Korach, motivated by jealousy and a desire for honor, rejected Moses' authority and claimed that the appointment of Aaron as *Kohen Gadol* (Head Kohen) was motivated by nepotism. Korach cleverly persuaded 250 judges and others from disaffected groups to become his followers in the rebellion. A frequent theme in the Torah is: Sooner or later G-d always gets the last word. In Korach's case, it was sooner. What was the result of the rebellion? G-d made the earth open up to swallow Korach, the ringleaders of the rebellion, and their families. Fire consumed the remainder of the 250 rebels. The story of Korach's rebellion concludes with an act of reconciliation -- and surprisingly, a U.S. Presidential reference. The staffs of the leaders of the 12 tribes were placed near the Ark of the Covenant. To prove that the tribe of Levi and Aaron was Divinely chosen, Aaron's staff sprouted leaves, almond blossoms and even almonds. I suppose you could say that this miracle made AaronChief of Staff!

Rabbinic Ruminations

That old expression, "the early bird gets the worm," turns out to be truer than ever in urban settings today. In fact, recent studies are finding that some birds in noisy environments have taken to singing at night in order to be heard over the din of the city. Our world is getting noisier. With dramatic increases in traffic, the explosion of digital gadgets (think of your friend's constantly chirping smartphone), and our increasing capacity to reach once-remote areas, quiet solitude is a diminishing commodity. So surely a national park is a refuge from the din and clamor of civilization, right? Yes ...and no. Over the span of 15 years, scientists with the National Park Service's Natural Sounds and Night Skies Division analyzed 1.5 million hours of recordings. In 2015, this division -- the only federal bureau devoted to researching noise pollution and protecting natural soundscapes -- publicly released a set of groundbreaking maps that predict the median sound levels across the U.S on a typical summer day.

With an arid climate, scant nearby development, and few flight paths overhead, Great Sand Dunes, in southern Colorado, is among our quietest national parks. In some of its massive isolated dunes, the average decibel level is lower than ten - quieter than very soft breathing. Great Sand Dunes is one of the quietest sites they've studied; Rock Creek, in Washington, D.C. is the loudest. In general, a growing number of studies indicate that animals, like humans, are stressed by noisy environments. The endangered Sonoran pronghorn (an animal similar to an antelope) avoids noisy areas frequented by military jets; female frogs exposed to traffic noise have more difficulty locating the male's signal; gleaning bats avoid hunting in areas with road noise.

The Torah's concern for a healthy, unpolluted environment can be demonstrated by a number of laws that are found in the Code of Jewish Law (*Shulchan Aruch*). For instance, one may not put out garbage (and by extension, other forms of pollution) in a public property, and if one did, the Rabbis would fine the person. Even noise pollution is regulated: Jewish law states that neighbors may force a new store to close if the noise made by the customer traffic is loud enough to disturb the neighbors' sleep. The Torah was "green" long before green became popular.
