Parshas: Bamidbar

This week we begin reading Sefer Bamidbar -- known in English as 'The Book of Numbers'. Bamidbar ('in the wilderness') begins with G-d telling Moses to take a census of all men over the age of 20. If you like names and numbers, you'll love this week's portion. The count reveals just over 600,000, excluding the Levites who weren't included in the census. We also find described the manner in which the Jewish People camped around the Mishkan (Tabernacle), and the order in which they traveled

during the 40 years in the desert. The Jewish People were arranged in four sections around the Mishkan; east, south, west and north. The Levites are singled out for special responsibilities. A formal transfer is made between the first-born and the Levites, whereby the Levites take over the role the first-born would have served. The sons of Levi are divided into three main families; Gershon, Kehas and Merari. Each is given a special task in transporting the Mishkan.





Effective Sunday, May 28, 2017, the Kelim mikvah at 4 Millstone Campus, will be accessible via the door in the rear of the building. We ask the community to please be diligent in upholding the following rules:

- 1. The Kelim mikvah door is in the rear of the building. The code to enter is Aleph, Gimmel, Hey. Access will be to the Kelim mikvah room ONLY. No restroom or access to the rest of the mikvah will be available.
- 2. Please use the parking lot in front of the building. Do not park along the side of the building or on the grass behind the building. There is a concrete path along the side and back of the building that should be used.
- 3. It is absolutely forbidden for anyone to be in the Kelim mikvah past 7:00 pm during the summer months. This time will be modified for the winter months. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 4. During office hours, please use the Vaad office door to gain entrance to the Kelim mikvah.

If these rules for use of the Kelim mikvah will be disregarded e.g., being present in the building past 7:00 pm in the summer, the public's access to the Kelim mikvah in this manner will be reassessed.
