Tribute Correction – From: Gary Benson in memory of Jack Tepper

Parshas: Acharei / Kedoshim

Acharei begins with a lengthy description of the special Yom Kippur service to be performed in the Mishkan by the Kohen Gadol. The service included the lottery selection from among two identical goats, one of which would become a national sin offering and the other to be pushed off a cliff in the desert as the bearer of the people's sins (the 'scapegoat'). We also find described the command that Yom Kippur and its laws of fasting and refraining from work be observed eternally by the Jewish people as a day of atonement. Acharei concludes with a listing of the immoral and forbidden sexual relationships, and the command that the Jewish people maintain and ensure the holiness of the land of Israel.

Kedoshim begins with G-d's command to the entire nation of Israel to be holy, emulating the supreme sanctity of G-d Himself. The Torah goes on to delineate a multitude of mitzvos through which we can achieve sanctity, covering a wide variety of subjects, both positive commandments and negative injunctions, dealing with our unique relationships to G-d and our fellow man. Amongst the highlights: revere your parents, guard Shabbos from desecration, have honest dealings with our neighbors, refrain from tale-bearing, don't hate your brother in your heart, and the well-known commandment to love your friend as yourself. Kedoshim concludes with the commandment that we be a holy and distinct people from among the nations of the world.

...Ladue High School Again one of Missouri's Top Schools

YET ANOTHER REASON TO MOVE NEAR NHBZ!!

We are fortunate in St. Louis to have several fine Jewish high schools to choose from, and each provides a top notch religious and secular education. However, for those seeking a public school option, we are very pleased to have the top public high school in Missouri in our own backyard!



Each year, *U.S. News & World Report* releases its list of best high schools in America. In Missouri alone, 517 schools were considered and ranked by *U.S. News & World Report*, while more than 22,000 were considered nationally. Continuing its past strong ranking, Ladue Horton Watkins High School (LHWHS) is again among the very top Missouri schools (Public, Charter and Magnet) in the annual ranking of *Best High Schools*. LHWHS ranked 2nd and was the top rated public

school. U. S. News awarded named just two Gold Medal schools, 22 Silver Medal Schools and 122 Bronze Medal schools in Missouri, with LHWHS as one of the only two Gold Medal recipients in Missouri. Of the more than 22,000 schools ranked nationwide, LHWHS was overall ranked 363, and 180 among STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) High Schools!

This ranking recognizes schools that provide an academically rigorous program, while best preparing them for college. The study bases its rankings on many factors, including student-to-teacher ratio and how prepared students are for college upon graduation. Test scores considered include Advanced Placement (AP) exams, along with end-of-course exams.


