Purim

This coming Wednesday night/ Thursday is the holiday of Purim. Purim is arguably the most joyous holiday on the Jewish calendar. If you would only have one day a year to attend synagogue, Purim might be that day. Purim is celebrated with the 'Four Ms' -- in the following 4 ways:

- 1) **Megilla:** On Purim we read the Book of Esther, which recalls the attempt of the evil Haman (boo!) to wipe out the Jews of Persia.
 - 2) **Mishloach Manos:** We send gifts of food to friends and relatives ...at least two ready-to-eat food items in each package, delivered by a proxy. The joy of the day increases as we send and receive.
 - 3) **Matanos L'Evyonim:** We don't forget those with less . . . at least 2 gifts of money and/or food to the poor on Purim day.
 - 4) **Mishteh:** The merry, merry meal on Purim day . . . an easy mitzvah to fulfill.
- Purim represents the height of joy -- so enjoy!

Parshas: Tetzaveh

This week's portion is a haberdasher's dream. Following on the heels of the elaborate details of the construction of the Mishkan, G-d describes to Moses the special garments which are to be worn by the Kohanim during their service. The ordinary Kohanim would wear four special garments, while four additional vestments were to be worn exclusively by the Kohen Gadol (High Priest). All of these garments were woven and crafted from materials donated by the people.

The Torah portion then shifts its attention to G-d's commandments regarding the inauguration ritual for the newly constructed Mishkan, to be performed exclusively by Moses for seven days. The inauguration included Moses' adorning and anointing the Kohanim, and his bringing offerings. On the eighth day, Aaron and his sons would assume their offices as the Kohanim. After then describing the daily offering to be brought in the Mishkan, in the morning and afternoon, the portion concludes with the command to build the last of the Mishkan's structures, the golden altar upon which the incense would be offered twice daily.

Ancient Talmud Found in Jerusalem Dig – Gives Green Light to Shabbos Texting*

Olivette, March 1 – The Orthodox Jewish world was shaken today by the announcement that a Talmud volume discovered last month in the City of David archaeological dig in Jerusalem seems to provide justification for the use of cell phones to send text messages on Shabbat. The Talmud scrolls, titled Tractate *Textin*, describe the way HaShem communicated with the Kohen Gadol in the Temple. The high priest wore a breastplate on a special garment called an *ephod*, that contained twelve colored stones. Linguists now are suggesting that *ephod*, *iPod*, and *iPad* all have the same root. When the people of Israel inquired of G-d concerning an important issue, the high priest asked HaShem the question and HaShem answered through the twelve stones by making the stones glow in a sequence. This is the earliest known form of texting, and there are no specific prohibitions in the Torah nor halachic opinions in Talmud *Textin* that bar such communication on Shabbat.



Even though e-readers such as Kindle, Nook, and iPad may be used on Shabbat, the latest model of the Kindle, the Kindle Fire is specifically forbidden in the Torah. (Exodus 35:3) which says "You shall not **Kindle Fire** throughout all your habitations upon the Sabbath day."

New iPhone Apps Rushed to Market to Meet Demand for Use on Shabbat*

Editor's Note: The newly approved use of cell phones and e-readers on Shabbat has created a surge of development of new applications for these devices. Here is a sampling of some of the best new Shabbat apps.



Kiddush Buddy – Uses GPS to find all kiddushes in nearby shuls and reports which are hot, cold, and how far away.



Kid Finder – Works with implanted chip to locate your child and sound alarm if he/she leaves the synagogue building.



Service Length Predictor – Gives realtime estimate of when the service will end. Accounting for traffic delays such as unusually long lulav lines on Sukkot.



Snooze Alert – Recognizes snoring and slumping of cell phone owner during sermon and produces a gentle vibration to wake him from his slumber.



Conversation Connector – Identifies current conversations in shul (sports, finance, loshon hara) and directs user to seats corresponding to topics of interest.



Pledge Counter – For use by shul gabbai to enter pledges made by congregants when they are called to the Torah during services.



Page Finder – Continuously samples ten seconds of Chazzan's singing and displays current page in siddur. Versions available for ArtScroll, Koren, Shilo, and Kehot siddurim.

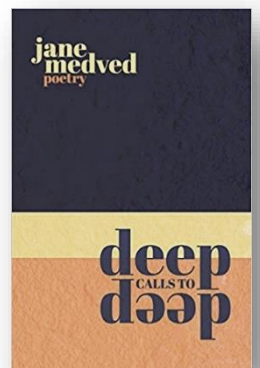
