- Tu B-Shevat (15th of Shevat) (Thursday, January 20) The "new year for trees" determines the age of trees for the purpose of tithing. Vayikra 19:23-25 states that fruit from trees may not be eaten during the first three years; the fourth year's fruit is for HaShem, and after that, you can eat the fruit. Each tree is considered to have aged one year as of Tu B'Shevat. It is customary to eat a new seasonal fruit on this day, or to eat from the Seven Species abundant in the land of Israel as described in Devarim 8:8: wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives and dates. Some people plant trees on this day.
- Parashas Yisro (Saturday, January 22) In the normal course of the reading of the Torah, the Ten Commandments are read twice a year: in parashas Yisro and parashas Va'eschanan. The Ten Commandments were given by HaShem Himself, and they contain the essence of the entire Torah. Tradition teaches that all the commandments can be found within the Ten Commandments. The commandments make Judaism more than a mere religious philosophy. It is a way of life involving action and observance, rather than a mere confession of faith. It is a widespread custom for the congregation to stand while the Ten Commandments are being read.

- Bugles Original General Mills will be discontinuing the OU-D certification from all sizes of Bugles Original, but packages still displaying OU-D are kosher.
- Sardines This year, many factors have combined to create a very unusual fishing year and an increase in sardines containing undigested krill, a small shrimp-like crustacean, in their stomachs. While this is rare, and fluctuates seasonally, all fresh sardines should be inspected prior to consumption or remove the stomach to eliminate any concern. Skinless and boneless sardines are not affected, since their stomachs have already been removed.

Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as 'The Ari'. There exist twelve gates of prayers in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



A mole is born to dig. It has widened front paws, with long claws and appendages joined together to form a shovel-like digging tool. Its body is extremely flexible, enabling it to maneuver easily through the scores of tunnels it digs. Its head is designed for its life of digging as well: It is flattened, its nose is protected with a horn-like material, and

its eyes are covered with thick hide. Despite the covering, it can detect light and darkness.

Although Bruce Springsteen claimed he was 'Born to Run' (in the song, anyway), humankind's unique feature is a *Tzelem Elokim*, a soul created in the image of G-d. What is this 'Image of G-d' to be used for? Like G-d, we have inherent holiness and dignity. A mole's mission statement is to burrow. Parshas Beshalach: Exodus 13:17 - 17:16



As the Jewish people leave the land of Egypt, Pharaoh's heart is once again hardened. The Egyptian army pursues the former slaves, trapping them on the shores of the Red Sea. Moses raises his hand

over the sea, miraculously parting the waters and allowing the Jewish people to pass through safely. Pursued by the Egyptians into the sea, Moses once again raises his hand and the waters come crashing down upon Pharaoh's army. Awed by this indisputable miracle, Moses leads the Jewish people in the *Shir Shel Yam*, a song of praise to G-d acknowledging a debt of gratitude for their remarkable salvation.

After traveling from the Red Sea, and following the miraculous sweetening of the bitter waters at *Marah*, the Jewish people complain to Moses and Aaron that they have no food to eat. G-d responds by providing a great test of faith; a daily ration of manna fell from the sky for forty years every morning, except for Shabbos. Some suggest that the manna was the greatest miracle the Jewish people ever experienced. A constant water source is also given when G-d commands Moses to strike a rock, miraculously causing water to flow from it. The portion concludes with the nation of *Amalek's* unprovoked sneak attack and the Jewish people's victory.

Rabbinical Ruminations



Do women cry more than men? Dr. William Frey, a biochemist and director of the Dry Eye and Tear Research Center in Minneapolis says "yes." Dr. Frey worked with 331 volunteers, aged 18 to 75, asking them to keep a "tear diary" for 30 days. Women reported crying four to five times more

than men during this period. It is of interest that studies show no difference in crying patterns between boys and girls until the age of puberty. But by the time they are eighteen women cry on average about 5.3 times a month compared to a man's 1.4 times per month.

When women chop onions, their crying may be unavoidable. However, the Talmud says that one should always be heedful of wronging his wife, because she is easily hurt and her tears are frequent. A wife is the source of blessing for her husband; she is the vessel for the husband's blessings and in her the blessings are found. Rabbi Chaim Vital, one of the great kabbalists, said, "A man's soul is judged in the next world according to how he treated his wife."
