Beyond Twelve Gates

'Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as '*The Ari*'. There exist twelve gates of prayers in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. Additionally, there exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates. You may have noticed that that often, the best keep getting better. How do they do it? Jessica Tandy, Oscar winner for her role in Driving Miss Daisy, was asked if any of her performances have left her unsatisfied. "All of them," she instantly replied. "I've never come off the stage at the end of a performance and said, 'tonight was perfect.' There'll always be some little thing that I'll have to get right tomorrow." Hall of Fame basketball player Larry Bird said, "Once you're labeled the best, you want to stay up there, and you can't do it by loafing around. If I don't keep changing, I'm history." To the best, 'good enough' isn't good enough. Should we settle for any less?

Parshas Vayikra 1:1 — 5:26

This Shabbos marks the beginning of our reading the third book of the Torah, Sefer Vayikra, which deals primarily with the services and responsibilities of the Kohanim. This week's portion focuses on many of the *korbanos* (offerings) to be brought in the newly-constructed *Mishkan*. Parshas Vayikra begins with G-d calling Moses into the *Mishkan* where he will receive the many relevant



mitzvos to be ultimately passed on to the Jewish people. The first half of the Torah portion describes the various optional *korbanos* brought by individuals. They can be classified into three general categories, each one comprised of several gradations in size and expense; the *korban olah* (elevation offering) which is completely consumed on the altar; the *korban mincha* (meal offering) which, because of its inexpensive contents, is usually brought by someone of modest means; and the *korban shelamim* (peace offering) partially burned on the altar, with the remainder divided between the owners and the Kohanim. The second half of the portion (beginning with chapter four) discusses the required *chatos* (sin) and *asham* (guilt) offerings to be brought in atonement for unintentional transgressions.

Rabbinic Ruminations

Have you ever heard of the saying, "there are no atheists in a foxhole"? That saying expresses the idea that although a person might profess doubts or even disbelief about the existence of G-d, when the bullets are whizzing overhead, even a confirmed atheist will look to G-d for help. The chairman of the board of a major company in America, with branches in over two hundred cities, said that because of the nature of their business they give polygraph (lie detector) tests to every prospective employee. They ask many questions, and *always* ask each prospective employee "Do you believe there is a G-d?" In 100 percent of the cases, when the person replies "No," the polygraph needle literally jumps, indicating that person deep down does believe that there is a G-d.

Belief and trust in G-d are unifying principles of life — they give life meaning, definition and direction. Belief and trust nurture a person and provide the spiritual "glue" that holds life together and keeps a focus on goals and the future. Fortunately, there exists a foundation of belief and trust which is built into every person. As parents we need to build on that foundation by taking — not sending — our children to synagogue. One study shows that when mom and dad take the kids to religious services, 72 percent will follow the faith of their parents into adulthood. If dad takes the kids, 55 percent will follow the faith. If mom alone takes the kids only 15 percent will follow the faith. If neither parent takes the kids to religious services, only 6 percent will end up in the faith.

FROM THE VAAD: As a reminder to the public to be aware that just because a product is found in the "Kosher for Passover" section of a supermarket, does not necessarily mean it is Kosher for Passover. Most food products require special certification for Passover. Look for a "P" designation next to the kosher symbol, or specific "Kosher L'Pesach" mention made on the product. Since there are some products on the market that say "Kosher for Passover," but contain kitniyos (such as peanuts, beans, peas, similar items from the legume family, corn, bean sprouts, alfalfa sprouts, green beans, mustard, and foods derived from these) or other problematic ingredients, we recommend that consumers use accepted national certifications such as the OV, OU, OK, Kof-K, cRc, Star-K, etc. It is very important to check every label. Local St. Louis supermarkets do not consult the Vaad regarding Passover products. Often they do not even separate Kosher for Passover from Non-Kosher for Passover items. Only Simon Kohn's and Diamants are under Vaad Hoeir supervision. Please do not hesitate to call the Vaad office with any questions, especially if you are in doubt -- 314-569-2770.

Kashrus Note: The confectioner's sugar sold by Wal-Mart under their Great Value brand is mistakenly labeled Kosher for Passover. The product, although certified kosher for year-round use by United Mehadrin, is NOT certified for Passover use.
