Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as 'The Ari'. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

## **Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates**



In the 1978 film, *The End*, Burt Reynolds portrays a man with a terminal illness, who in desperation hires a homicidal maniac to kill him. When he discovers he does not have a terminal illness, he must artfully dodge his hired predator. In one scene, Reynolds' character bargains with G-d, "If you will spare my life, I will give you 90% of everything I earn." When the danger of Reynolds' assassination apparently diminishes, the bargain with G-d rapidly diminishes to 80%, 70%, 60%, 50%, 40% - down to nothing. When the assassin suddenly appears again, Reynolds' character renews the 90% pledge until the danger passes again.

We've all heard the adage, "There is no atheist in a foxhole." When the going gets tough, even an atheist seem to be able to find it within himself to offer a prayer or two. Danger seems to have an ability to bring out the "believer" from within even the most ardent disbeliever. There exists a common element to humanity's need to relate to our Creator. Whether a person is a corporate executive, a farmer, a multi-millionaire, or simply a self-proclaimed atheist, when all efforts fail to bring about the desired success, we recognize our limitations. Whether our prayers are expressions of praise and gratitude, or requests for assistance, the root of prayer is the same for everyone.

## **Shabbos Chol HaMoed Sukkos**

### **Exodus 33:12 - 34:26**



On the Shabbos that falls during the Intermediate Days (*Chol HaMoed*) of Sukkos the regular cycle of Torah readings is interrupted with a reading that reflects the theme of the holiday. Our reading this Shabbos is a section of the book of Exodus. Specifically, it is the text from divisions (*aliyos*) three through six of Parsha Ki Sisa, but newly divided into seven *aliyos* for a complete Shabbos reading.

Ki Sisa, you will remember, is when Moses comes down from Mount Sinai with the first set of tablets to find that the Jewish people had made a golden calf. Moses breaks the tablets and G-d punishes the guilty. This Shabbos' reading begins right after that

point. Toward the end of this Torah reading, G-d gives the commandments to observe the three festivals of Passover, Shavuot, and Succos and to appear in Jerusalem on those three occasions.

## **Shemini Atzeres and Simchas Torah**



Shemini Atzeres is a two-day holiday immediately following the seventh day of Sukkos. It begins on Monday. Simchas Torah is celebrated on Tuesday, the second day of Shemini Atzeres. The Torah reading for the first day is Deuteronomy 14:22 -16:17.

Shemini Atzeres is a holiday in its own right. 'Shemini Atzeres' literally means 'Stop (on) the Eighth Day'. Benjamin Franklin once said, 'fish and visitors smell in three days'. The Almighty, however, has a different perspective! G-d, who has had us as 'visitors' for Sukkos, asks us to stay with Him for an eighth day. Seeing our loved ones leave is difficult; so too, G-d loves His children and desires that we spend one more day with Him in festive celebration.

On Simchas Torah we read the final Torah portion, V'zos Ha'Bracha (Deuteronomy 33:1 -- 34:12). We then immediately proceed to the first chapter of Genesis, reminding us that the Torah is a circle which never ends. The completion of the Torah is a time of great celebration. There are processions around the synagogue carrying Torah scrolls, with plenty of high-spirited singing and dancing.

## **Rabbinic Ruminations**



Have you ever heard someone say that something "passed the smell test"? The "smell test" is an idiom for an informal method of determining whether something is true by using one's common sense. Our actual physical sense of smell can reveal more than we might imagine. Each one of our nostrils contains approximately 10 million specialized sensory cells (olfactory receptors), which respond to airborne chemicals and send the message on to the brain. The brain can identify and remember an astounding 10,000 different types of smells.

A recent study has found that everybody has a unique body odor, like their fingerprints, that could be

used as an unique identifier. Your signature odor - your "eau d'you" - remains even if you vary your diet with strong smelling foods such as garlic and spices. Smelling people can reveal your mate, as a quick whiff allows the body to detect a person's genetic makeup. The U.S. Department of Defense has invested \$3 million in the development of a device that can identify people according to their body odor. It has also been found that the body odors of identical twins are significantly more similar than the scents of unrelated people.

The sense of smell is thousands of times more sensitive than the sense of taste; however, a vocabulary that exactly describes smells, such as we've developed for color, has never been developed. This is because the sense of smell is spiritual, a part of the neshama, as it says (Tehillim 150:6) 'let all the neshama praise G-d'. What is the thing that benefits the neshama? The answer is: aroma. However, the other senses are more physical and more frequently subject to error.

### Question:

**Why do we have the custom of dancing in a circle on Simchas Torah?**

### Answer:

The mystics teach that when unity exists among G-d's ambassadors -- the Jewish People -- to that extent G-d's Unity is revealed in this world. When we have *achdus* (unity), G-d's presence is unmistakably detected. When we fulfill the commandment of "And you will love your friend as yourself," (Leviticus 19:18), and love each other and are genuinely happy for our friends' successes, this causes a greater perception of G-d in the world. When there is resentment, envy and hatred, we take a step away from the type of world we want to create.

On Simchas Torah we complete the annual reading of the Torah. As soon as we finish the last verse we start again at the beginning. We read the Torah in a continuous cycle because a circle is a symbol of eternity. The Torah goes on forever, just as the One who gave us the Torah is Eternal.

Thus there exists the ancient custom of dancing for hours around the *bima* (Torah-reading table) on Simchas Torah -- the holiday on which we celebrate the completion of the yearly Torah cycle. This circle of dancing symbolizes the eternity of the Torah and its Author.
