"Cheap Thrills: An Ivory Gull Visits Missouri!"

This past January, Jason Mullins of Quincy, Illinois, spotted an unusual gull perched on a patch of ice in the Mississippi River. To his amazement, he confirmed that it was an Ivory Gull from the high arctic regions of the world. The gull crossed over to the Missouri side of the river, resting on the barges tied there -- making it the first recorded Missouri sighting of an ivory gull. "This is an exceedingly rare bird to spot this far south," said Knox College biology professor Jim Mountjoy. "Anywhere in the continental United States, it's pretty hard to see. Even if you go to Alaska, it's sometimes quite difficult." People who've seen an Ivory Gull say its fine-textured feathers are so snowy white they appear to glow. The Ivory Gull only rarely comes south of the Bering Sea or the Maritime Provinces. In fact, it rarely is found away from pack ice, spending the winter on the ice north of Newfoundland. And its claws are extra-long for gripping pack ice in its native Arctic habitat. (http://www.arkive.org/ivory-gull/pagophila-eburnea/)

Word of the rare visitor quickly spread among bird enthusiasts, and soon birders from all over the Midwest descended upon Quincy to get a glimpse of the bird. When Kansas resident and president of the Kansas Ornithological Society, Matt Gearheart heard about the "uber-rare event" through a birding email group, he and a flock of fellow bird fanatics piled into a car at 4:30 a.m. They drove across Missouri in ice, snow and bitter cold to get a gander of the gull. The crew headed for a spot where the bird has been sighted. Dozens of other birders huddled in cars with binoculars, others shivered on a bridge in the blustery 10-degree cold with spotting scopes on tripods. During the bird's Illinois/Missouri visit, over 100 reports of the bird were posted on eBird.org, an online, real-time bird listing website. Jason Mullins, first to spot the Ivory Gull, considers himself very lucky to be able to see such a magnificent creature. "It's the bird of a lifetime," Jason said. "It really is."

Rav Shlomo Wolbe said. "Every individual, like Adam, is an entire world. The existence of billions of people does not detract from each person's uniqueness. Hashem has sent me into the world with a unique mission that no one else can fulfill, only I in my one-time existence." Appreciate that you're a rare bird. You are even more rare than an arctic Ivory Gull.

Parshas Ki Sisa Exodus 30:11 -- 34:35

The portion begins with G-d's command to Moses to take a census by collecting an equal contribution of a half-shekel coin from every adult male between the ages of 20 and 60, with the profits going to the Mishkan

(Tabernacle). G-d designates Betzalel, of the tribe of Judah, and Oholiav, of the tribe of Dan, to supervise the upcoming construction of the Mishkan. The mitzvah of Shabbat is then repeated to caution the nation that even the construction of the Mishkan does not supersede the observance of the weekly day of rest.

The Torah returns to the narrative of the Revelation at Mt. Sinai and describes the horrible sin of the golden calf. G-d relents to Moses' prayer that the Children of Israel should be spared from annihilation for this great transgression, and Moses descends from the mountain with the two tablets of the Ten Commandments in hand. Upon witnessing a small segment of the population dancing around the golden calf, Moses smashes the tablets and burns the idol, initiating the process of repentance. Moses again ascends the mountain to pray to G-d that the Jewish people should be forgiven and regain their status as the chosen people. Moses eventually returns with the second set of tablets and a renewed covenant with G-d, his face radiant as a result of the Divine experience.
