 - <u>Sweet Perry Orchards Cashew Medley</u> is certified as an OU Dairy product. This product contains dairy yogurt chips as indicated on the front and back of the packaging. Some packages mistakenly have a plain OU without the D Dairy designation. Corrective actions have been implemented.
 - <u>Moses Vodka from Global Drinks Finland</u> bears an unauthorized OU P. The Orthodox Union does not certify this product for Passover or year round use. Corrective actions have been implemented.
 - <u>RCC</u> The Vaad Hoeir usually does not send out a Kashrus Alert when specific products become kosher certified. However, due to the popularity of the following items and the numerous calls we have received as to their kosher status, we wanted to let the public know that due to a change in kosher certification, the Vaad Hoeir now accepts these products.
