

Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as *'The Ari'*. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



It was billed as a "China-U.S. Basketball Friendship Match", though it was anything but friendly. The game between the Georgetown men's basketball team and a Chinese

professional club deteriorated into a benchesclearing brawl in which players exchanged blows, chairs were thrown and spectators tossed full water bottles at players and coaches. The scene was chaotic, with members of the Georgetown and Bayi Military Rockets teams swinging wildly and tackling one another. Georgetown intended for the team's 10-day trip to China to be an athletic, cultural and educational exchange designed to promote the school internationally. A State Department official and a Chinese Embassy spokesman in Washington both called the melee "unfortunate."

Eleanor Roosevelt said, "It isn't enough to talk about peace, one must believe it. And it isn't enough to believe in it, one must work for it." Without Shalom ('peace', in Hebrew) in a family, in a community, or between nations -- little else has much worth. The Talmud teaches, "The Holy One, Blessed be He, found no vessel to hold blessing for Israel other than (the vessel of) Peace." Like a precious vessel, Shalom is difficult to create but easily broken. You can't shake hands with a clenched fist; take action to create Shalom.

Parshas Re'eh - Deuteronomy 11:26 - 16:17



Moses informs the Jewish people that we each face a choice; choose to observe G-d's directions for living (i.e. the Torah) and receive blessings, or choose to

ignore G-d and experience estrangement and its consequences. Moses then turns to describing a number of religious, civil and social laws relevant once the Jewish people enter the Promised Land. Included in this listing are:

- Don't imitate the ways of the nations surrounding you
- A false prophet who attempts to entice you to idolatry should be put to death

- Since the Torah is complete and perfect, nothing may be added to or subtracted from it
- Self infliction of wounds on the body as a sign of mourning is prohibited
- As a holy people, refrain from eating 'non-kosher' food
- Be particularly warm-hearted and charitable (many laws and guidelines concerning tzedakah, i.e. righteous giving, are found in this week's portion)
- The three pilgrimage festivals (Passover, Shavuos and Sukkos) are opportunities to ascend (make aliyah) to Jerusalem and the Temple to celebrate our blessings

Rabbinic Ruminations



Ambrose Bierce had an interesting definition of a common household pest. He wrote: "MOUSE n. an animal which strews its path with fainting women." However, Israeli

startup company Bioexplorers, using mice, has hit upon a new way to sniff out terrorists -- literally.

Here's how it works: A person passes through a passageway in which a Bioexplorers system is installed. A fan passes air into a sensor receptor, and delivers it into a chamber with several mice. The mice, having excellent sense of smell, sniff the air. If the odor is one associated with items the mice have been trained to recognize, like drugs or bombs, they move into another chamber — setting off an alarm. Security officers can then move in and stop the appropriate suspect. The mice rarely make an error, are easy to train, and the entire procedure is far less invasive or intimidating than alternatives such as dogs or X-ray machines. There's no radiation, and no concern about being seen naked.

A person can elevate the world to a higher level by using it to serve G-d. It is beyond our comprehension to understand the purpose of each part of creation. However, the Torah teaches that all of G-d's creation was made for the benefit of man. When we are blessed with Divine insight, we can see how various components of our world can be used to protect us and to assist us in achieving our purpose in life. We can only join King David as he expresses in amazement (Psalms 104:24) "How abundant are Your


