# Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as *'The Ari'*. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

### Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



If you have too much time on your hands, too much money in the bank, and own your own island, I have a big idea for you: Write your name in

the sand so large that it can be seen from space. Hamad Bin Hamdan Al Ahyan, a super-rich Arab sheikh who is president of the oil-rich United Arab Emirates gets the credit for this original way of 'making a big name for himself.' The Sheikh's workmen toiled for weeks to scour "HAMAD" onto the sand of his privately owned island named Al Futaisi. The inscription measures half a mile high and two miles long - and the letters are dug so deep that the "H" and the first "A", and part of the "M" form waterways. Hamad has always been a man who lives large. His fleet of more than 200 cars - including seven Mercedes 500 SELs painted in different colors of the rainbow - are housed in a custom-built pyramid. He once com-missioned the building of a unique motor home in the shape of a giant globe "one millionth the size of the Earth." With a \$20 billion fortune second in the Mideast only to the king of Saudi Arabia, Hamad has money for expansive (and expensive) projects.

Jewish consciousness says that a true 'big name' is something that must be earned, not inscribed. In the words of Ethics of the Fathers (2:8), "He who acquires a good name, has acquired himself something indeed." In contrast to wealth which we spend a lifetime amassing -- quite possibly only to have it fall into the hands of others -- a good name is carried on beyond the grave. The shifting sands of time erase artificial constructs. But a good name earned with sterling character and righteous deeds lasts forever.

### Parshas Ki Seitzei – Deuteronomy 21:10 – 25:19



This week's Torah portion contains 74 mitzvos (commandments) -- more than 10% of the 613 mitzvos of the Torah. Among the highlights:

- Guidelines for treatment of captured female prisoners of war
- Treatment of the 'stubborn and rebellious son'

- Prohibition of wearing shatnez a mixture of wool and linen in the same garment
- The case of the defamation of a married woman
- Men are forbidden from wearing women's clothing and vice versa
- Taking interest for lending to a Jew is forbidden
- The requirement of a 'get' (bill of divorce) when divorce takes place
- The obligation to pay workers in a timely fashion (handymen, babysitters, etc)
- Special consideration must be given to a widow and orphan

This power-packed Torah portion concludes with the command to remember the atrocities which the nation of Amalek (from whom Haman and Hitler came) committed against us upon our exodus from Egypt.

### Rabbinic Ruminations



Dale Carnegie said, "When fate hands you lemons, make lemonade." A study of wealthy individuals found that some with a

lemon called 'dyslexia' are more likely to be millionaires. Of 5,000 self-made millionaires who were interviewed, nearly 40 percent reported that they had been diagnosed with dyslexia. Adrian Atkinson, a business psychologist who worked with the research group, noted that "Most people who make a million have difficult childhoods or have been frustrated in a major way. Dyslexia is one of the driving forces behind that."

When learning to read, dyslexia can seem like a curse; however, in many students this manifests itself into an incredible work ethic and an acceptance of turning mistakes into a positive scenario. Rex Ryan, coach of the New York Jets and a dyslexic, said, "For the weaknesses I have with spelling and all those other things with being dyslexic, I have a lot of other strengths also, many because of my struggle with dyslexia." Richard Branson, a billionaire and the head of Virgin Industries, made his first million by the age of 18. He is dyslexic. Walt Disney, and Donald Winkler, former CEO of Ford Financial, are other very successful people with learning disabilities.

# FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions) about our new Shul

- 1. Where is my seat? We are trying a different seating layout this Shabbos from what we had last Shabbos. One of the benefits of having everything movable is that we have the flexibility to accommodate various needs and situations.
- 2. When will the elevator work in Shabbos Mode? As of this writing, the Elevator Company is planning to program the elevator for Shabbos Mode on Friday morning, and we hope that it will be working as you read this.
- How does the Shabbos elevator work? The elevator will stop on each floor for a minute or two with the door open. Simply step into the elevator and wait for the door to close and the elevator to move to the other floor. The elevator will operate like this
- 4. To what address should I mail my donation checks? 650 N. Price Road, St. Louis, MO
- 5. What door should I use to reach the office during the week? The North entrance on the lower level will be accessible during regular office hours and on Shabbos. The South entrance on the upper level will be accessible on Shabbos morning.
- 6. Where can I find a tallis to use on Shabbos? There are talleisim available on the shelf in the lobby coatroom. Eventually we will have a tallis rack or cabinet.
- 7. Where can I find the Shabbos Bulletin? The Shabbos Bulletin is available on a table in the main lobby.
- 8. Where are my Siddur and Chumash? Each seat has a book rack beneath it that is accessible from the rear. Your books are under the seat in front of you. If you are a man sitting where there is not seat in front of you, books are available in the bookcase in front of the Shulchan. If you are a woman sitting where there is not a seat in front of you, we are working on a solution.
- 9. What should I do if I have an idea for an enhancement to the new building or if I want to purchase something for the new building? – Talk to any Board member.
