The passage is chosen for this time because of the need to purify oneself for Pesach, in preparation for the pilgrimage to Jerusalem and the Temple; the corresponding haftorah portion is Ezekiel 36:16-38, which also talks about purification.

In the Hebrew calendar, months are counted from Nisan in the spring, but years are counted from the month of Tishri in the fall. The corresponding haftarah portion is Ezekiel 45:16-46:18, which also talks about the first months and the offerings at that time.

• Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as 'The Ari'. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



Goldy Gopher never saw it coming. An annoyed fan - a math professor who had received his doctorate from the University of Minnesota - punched the fuzzy-suited mascot during a

men's gymnastics meet. The mascot-mauling left the professor embarrassed, regretful, and banned for a year from the University's sports arena.

Douglas Dokken, 60, was trying to watch the competition when in good fun, Goldy tapped the professor on the shoulder and then moved to the other side. The buck-toothed mascot had already played the same trick on a few others, eliciting smiles from his victims and laughter from the kids trailing him. Then suddenly, without warning, Dokken turned and punched Goldy, knocking him back into the bleachers. The professor then stood over the mascot and punched him again. In a written statement, Dokken said he deeply regrets the incident. "I should have just walked out of there," he said.

Math professor Dokken would be the first to agree that losing your temper just doesn't add up. Though anger is a common reaction to stress or irritation, King Solomon said, "Don't let your spirit be quick to be angry for anger rests in the lap of fools" (Ecclesiastes 7:9). It's been said that the best cure for a short temper is a long walk. Impulsive outbursts of anger harm us in many ways. Anger is never without a reason, but seldom with a good one.

Parshas Shemini: Leviticus 9:1 - 11:47

This week's Torah portion begins by discussing the events which occurred on the eighth and final day of the inauguration service of the *Mishkan*. After months of preparation, Aaron and his sons are finally installed as Kohanim in an elaborate service. Aaron blesses the people, and the entire nation rejoices as G-d's presence rests upon them. However, the excitement comes to an abrupt halt as Aaron's two eldest sons, Nadav and Avihu, are consumed by a heavenly fire in the *Mishkan* while innovating an offering of incense on the altar. This incident stresses the need to perform the

commandments only as G-d directed. Later, Moses consoles Aaron, who grieves in silence.



Have you ever wondered where the laws of kosher food come from? *Parshas Shemini* concludes with a listing of the kosher and non-kosher animals. The identifying signs of a

kosher land animal are that it has split hooves and chews, regurgitates and re-chews its food. A kosher fish is one that has both fins and scales. All birds not included in the list of forbidden fowl are permitted. However, today the identities of these non-kosher birds are doubtful. Therefore, we're forbidden to eat any species of bird unless there is a well-established tradition that it is kosher. The Torah forbids all types of insects except for four species of locusts. Chocolate-covered grasshoppers, anyone? The laws of kashrut help us to be separate and holy -- like G-d, Himself.

Rabbinic Ruminations



How much would you pay for Albert Einstein's comb? What is Marilyn Monroe's hairpin worth to you? A new study in the *Journal of Consumer Research* explains why someone would

make out a check for \$49,000 for Michael Jackson's jeweled white glove or \$48,875 for a piece of costume jewelery previously owned by Jackie Kennedy. The psychological concept of "contagion" -- the belief that a person's immaterial qualities or essence can be transferred onto an object through physical contact -- is one explanation suggested by the study's authors. One experiment showed that a sweater previously touched by a well-liked celebrity, but later dry-cleaned, reduced participants' willingness to purchase the sweater.

It is uncertain whether any spiritual benefits are to be gained from owning a celebrity possession. The influence of a good neighbor or righteous person, however, is unmistakable. The Torah teaches: "Happy is the righteous man, and happy is his neighbor." When you walk into a store that sells flowers or perfume, even

without a purchase you still come out smelling nice. It's been said that a neighbor is like a book; if it's good, it can't last too long. If it's bad, you can't get rid of it too early.
