- **Shabbos HaChodesh** (*Shabbos of the Month*) We read an extra Torah portion on the Shabbos preceding the first day of Nisan, during which we celebrate Passover. This portion, Exodus 12:1-20, talks about preparations for Passover, which begins on Nisan 15. With one simple line, it establishes the Hebrew calendar: "This month shall be for you the beginning of the months, it shall be for you the first of the months of the year." In the Hebrew calendar, months are counted from Nisan in the spring, but years are counted from the month of Tishri in the fall. The corresponding haftorah portion is Ezekiel 45:16-46:18, which also talks about the first months and the offerings at that time.

Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as '*The Ari*'. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



Most of us occasionally misplace our car keys. And it may have happened that at the mall, you forgot where you parked the car. But did you ever forget that you **owned** a car? English

soccer player Jermaine Pennant was contacted by officials from his previous soccer team about a Porsche 911 Turbo that had been abandoned in the car park of a local railway station for five months, accumulating parking tickets. When he got the call, Pennant was nonplussed. No, he said, the car wasn't his. However, when told that the license plate of the abandoned car was 'P33NNT', the soccer star then acknowledged that he had forgotten that the \$135,000 car must belong to him -- something that can apparently happen when you make \$3.7 million a year playing soccer.

Mahatma Gandhi was asked what he thought of Western civilization. He said, "It would be nice." The more most people have, the more they want. We run the risk that instead of abundance filling a vacuum, it creates one. We would do well to remember the words of Rabbi Shimshon Raphael Hirsch: "It's not how much or how little you have that makes you great or small, but how much or how little you are with what you have."

Parshas Tazria: Leviticus 12:1 - 13:59



Parshas Tazria describes in great detail the varying and numerous manifestations of the disease called *tzara'as*. Although it has commonly been mistranslated as

leprosy, this skin disease bears little resemblance to any bodily ailment transmitted through normal exposure. Rather, *tzara'as* is the physical manifestation of a spiritual malaise, a punishment from G-d primarily for the sin of speaking *loshon hara*. *Loshon hara*, meaning literally 'the evil tongue', is often translated as 'gossip'. However, *loshon hara* is the Hebrew term for derogatory speech that is true. *Motzei shem rah* refers to derogatory speech about others that is false and slanderous.

The *metzora* (one diagnosed with *tzara'as*) was to be sent into isolation, tear his garments, and to call out

'contaminated, contaminated!' Since he abused his power of speech, sowing strife and distancing people from one another, it was fitting that he too should suffer the effects of isolation. The various punishments recorded in the Torah are not intended to serve as revenge for the sin; they are measures that will hopefully restore the person to the correct path.

Rabbinic Ruminations



Iconic actress Elizabeth Taylor passed away last week at the age of 79. While most will remember Taylor as one of Hollywood's most famous actresses, few are aware she was also a staunch supporter of Israel.

In 1959 she purchased \$100,000 in Israel Bonds, which prompted a ban of her films by authorities of the United Arab Republic. In 1967, Taylor played a major role in raising \$840,000 for Israel at a gala event in London. That same year, she cancelled a visit to Moscow after the Soviet Union harshly criticized Israel's actions in the Six Day War. In 1975, Taylor joined 59 other prominent women in signing a letter condemning the UN's equation of Zionism with racism. A year later in 1976, Taylor offered to take the place of 104 Israelis and foreign Jews who were being held hostage by PLO terrorists at Uganda's Entebbe Airport. In her later years, Taylor auctioned off her legendary collection of jewelry, and donated a sizable chunk of the earnings to the Israel War Victims Fund, one of her favorite charities.

Elizabeth Taylor's lifetime of courageous support for Israel brings to mind the teaching of Hillel (Ethics of the Fathers 2:6) ".....and in a place where there are no men, strive to be a man." There are times when circumstances in life require that we go against the tide. Even when no one else has the wisdom or courage to do the right thing, even when everyone else has become part of the faceless crowd, we still must rise to the occasion. As children of Abraham, we should remember that he was called the *'Ivri'* (the 'Hebrew'), because he stood on one side of the battle

As if you didn't have enough to do . . .

Don't forget to Sell Your Chametz - You may not own, eat or benefit from *chametz* during Passover; however, you can sell it to a non-Jew before Pesach. If you keep the sold chametz in your house, seal it away so that it will not be visible during the holiday. After Pesach, the non-Jew generally sells the chametz back to the original owner. It is time to sell! Rabbi Smason will act as your agent for the sale. See him after daily minyan, or call the office.
