

# Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as *'The Ari'*. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

#### Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



What scares Americans most? It isn't the dark, or thunder and lightning, or even flying on an airplane.

What really strikes fear in the hearts of many Americans are snakes. A recent Gallup poll reveals that more

people - 51% - fear snakes than any other suggested possibility, including speaking in public and heights. Rounding out the Top Ten List of Americans' fears are: being closed in a small place, spiders and insects, needles and getting shots, mice, flying on an airplane, dogs, and thunder and lightning. When it comes to fears - or at least admitting to them - clear gender differences emerge. The survey reveals that women are more likely than men to be fearful of reptiles, rodents and insects. Unexpectedly, the survey showed that men have greater fear than women of going to the doctor.

It has been said that 'fear is a darkroom where negatives develop.' While it is prudent to protect ourselves against real dangers, we have a confounding habit of worrying about remote possibilities. Fear can paralyze us and rob us of the joy of living. Realistically, there are few monsters who warrant the fear we have of them. But while there are many things in the world that can make us afraid, there is much more in faith in G-d that can make us unafraid. It would be wise to remember the words of Isaiah (41:13), "For I am the Lord your G-d who takes hold of your right hand and says to you, Do not fear. I will help you."

#### Parshas Balak - Numbers 22:2 - 25:9



This week's portion shifts from the Jewish people's travels in the desert to the story of Bilam, the anti-Semitic prophet who attempted to curse the Children of Israel. Hired by Balak, the

king of Moav, Bilam embarks upon a journey to the Israelite encampment. An angel brandishing a sword blocks Bilam's path, causing his donkey to repeatedly swerve off the road. Unable to see the angel, Bilam responds by striking the donkey three times. Miraculously, G-d causes the donkey to speak to

Bilam -- shades of Mr. Ed, the talking horse in the 1960's TV show! Bilam's eyes are uncovered, and the humiliated prophet sees the angel standing in the path. The angel reminds Bilam that he may only speak the words that G-d places in his mouth. Upon arrival near the Jewish camp, Bilam repeatedly attempts to curse the people; each time G-d prevents him from doing so, but instead he ends up uttering several sets of praises, much to Balak's dismay.

The Torah portion concludes with the Jewish men's debauchery with the promiscuous daughters of Moav and Midian, and the public immoral act of Zimri (a prince of the tribe of Simeon) with a Midianite princess. Pinchas, Aaron's grandson, zealously responds by piercing them to death with a spear, halting a plague from G-d which had broken out in the camp.

#### **Rabbinic Ruminations**



Don't underestimate the power of a good sense of humor. When 56-year-old tax consultant, Karen Butler of Oregon, awoke from denture implant surgery, the swelling began to subside but her new accent stuck. The affable woman now speaks with an accent that's a bit British with a

Transylvanian twang. Butler was diagnosed with Foreign Accent Syndrome -- a condition so rare that only about 60 cases have been documented worldwide. The new drawl is thought to stem from a minor injury to a tiny area of the brain responsible for language pattern and tone.

Because her accent flipped between tax seasons, Butler was forced to start many phone conversations explaining to her clients that she was indeed still Karen Butler, their tax consultant from Oregon. When asked where she got her accent from, she says 'from my dental surgeon.' Butler endures her fair share of good-spirited teasing -- mostly from her family. 
