Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic Rabbi Isaac Luria (1534-1572), also known as 'The Ari'. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

Think before you tweet.



Twitter is a powerful communication tool used by the likes of protesters, journalists, public officials -- and even rabbis. But tweeters should take caution. In a now Web-infamous incident, a Tweeter shared

the following message with the world:

"Cisco just offered me a job! Now I have to weigh the utility of a fatty paycheck against the daily commute to San Jose and hating the work." It wasn't long before a manager for Cisco shared this open response: "Who is the hiring manager. I'm sure they would love to know that you will hate the work. We here at Cisco are versed in the web."

In another incident, Israel Hyman and his wife went on Twitter to share real-time details of a trip from their Arizona home. Their posts said they were "preparing to head out of town," that they had "another 10 hours of driving ahead," and that they "made it to Kansas City." While they were on the road, their home was burglarized. Oy, Izzy!

Parshas Tzav: Leviticus 6:1 - 8:36 / Purim



The portion begins with G-d continuing to teach Moses many of the laws relating to the Mishkan service. However, while last week's portion described the korbanos

(offerings) from the perspective of the giver, this week the Torah focuses more directly on the Kohanim, providing details about their service. describing the maintenance of the fire which burned on the altar, the Torah discusses the various kinds of korbanos which Aaron, his sons, and the succeeding generations of Kohanim would be offering. offerings must be brought with the proper intentions and eaten in a state of spiritual purity. Finally, Moses performs the lengthy consecration service of the Mishkan, and Moses anoints Aaron and his sons for

their service in the Mishkan, in front of the entire congregation of Israel.



This coming Saturday night/Sunday is the holiday of Purim. Purim is arguably the most joyous holiday on the Jewish calendar. If you would have only two days a year to attend synagogue, Purim and

Simchas Torah should be your choices. Purim is celebrated with the 'Four M's' -- in the following 4 ways:

- 1) Megilla: On Purim we read the Book of Esther. which recalls the attempt of evil Haman (boo!) to wipe out the Jews of Persia
- 2) Mishloach Manos: We send gifts of food to friends and relatives - at least two ready-to-eat food items in each package, delivered by a proxy. The joy of the day increases as we send and receive
- 3) Matanos L'Evyonim: We don't forget those with less - at least 2 gifts of money and/or food to the poor on Purim day
- 4) *Mishteh*: The merry, merry meal on Purim dayan easy mitzva to fulfill

Purim represents the height of joy -- so enjoy!

Rabbinical Ruminations

Amazing stories of survival have emerged in Japan,



even amid the horrific destruction of the massive quake and subsequent tsunami that destroyed killed thousands, tens thousands of homes and stoked fears of a potential nuclear power plant meltdown.

One such story is that of a 60-year-old Japanese man who was rescued Sunday more than nine miles out at sea after clinging to a swept-away remnant of his roof for more than two days.

"I thought today was the last day of my life," Hiromitsu Shinkawa told his rescuers. "I was saved by holding onto the roof, but my wife was swept away," Hiromitsu said. Video showed him barely visible amid heaps of splintered wood, shattered homes and other debris loating more than nine miles at sea. He could be seen waving a self-made red flag.
