Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as *'The Ari'*. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



"Jewish Country Western Singer" may sound like an oxymoron. But don't tell that to Ray Benson, the nine-time Grammy-winning leader of the country western swing band 'Asleep at the Wheel.' At 6-foot-7, Benson literally and figuratively towers over the country

western scene. Until recently, Benson kept his religious identity out of the limelight. "I didn't want to be known as a Jewish country western singer; I wanted to be known as a country western singer who happens to be Jewish," he said. "For years, because I'm 6' 7" and people don't think Jews are tall, and because I guess I don't look like the stereotype Jew, most people don't know I'm Jewish."

In the 1970s, when his band first started touring, Benson repeatedly came up against offhand prejudice and ignorance about Jews and Judaism. He cites as an example a member of Tammy Wynette's entourage, who blamed "the Jews in New York" for failing to promote her career. Then there's the wife of a musician who had never heard of Judaism as a religion. "I asked her what she thought a Jew was, and she said, 'Someone who's cheap,' "Benson recalled. "So the stereotypes are there, and they're still there. I always felt myself to be an ambassador. I'm not a great practicing Jew on a daily basis, but I'm Jewish."

It is the privilege and responsibility of every Jew to sanctify our Creator's Name by living according to the highest standards of morality. Regardless of our level of Jewish education or observance, each of us is an ambassador for G-d and the Torah. Through living a life of honesty, compassion and sanctity, we can fulfill our mission of being a "Light unto the Nations."

<u> Parshas Vayikra – Leviticus 1:1 - 5:26</u>

This Shabbos marks the beginning of our reading the third book of the Torah, Sefer Vayikra, which deals primarily with the services and responsibilities of the Kohanim. This week's portion focuses on many of the korbanos (offerings) to be

brought in the newly-constructed Mishkan. Parshas Vayikra begins with G-d calling Moses into the Mishkan where he will receive the many relevant mitzvos to be ultimately passed on to the Jewish

people. The first half of the Torah portion describes the various optional korbanos brought by individuals. They can be classified into three general categories, each one comprised of several gradations in size and expense; the korban olah (elevation offering) which is completely consumed on the altar; the korban mincha (meal offering) which, because of its inexpensive contents, is usually brought by someone of modest means; and the korban shelamim (peace offering) partially burned on the altar, with the remainder divided between the owners and the Kohanim. The second half of the portion (beginning with chapter four) discusses the required chatos (sin) and asham (guilt) offerings to be brought in atonement for unintentional transgressions.

Rabbinic Ruminations



The male peacock is well known for its courtship displays, during which it fans its colorful tail feathers to attract a mate. But if attractive plumage fails to please her, perhaps she will fall for a trick used in Las Vegas casinos. At least, that is

the approach taken by male bowerbirds, who weave optical illusions into their bowers (structures made of sticks) that may fool potential mates into thinking that the males are larger than they are.

Bowerbirds, native to Australia and New Guinea, are renowned for the optical illusions they create by arranging objects in the bower court area from smallest to largest. This creates a forced perspective in which all of the objects in the court appear to be the same size. Consequently, the female will perceive the court as being smaller than it actually is, and the male to be bigger. During his courtship display, the male waves objects towards the female, causing their apparent size to increase. These visual tricks manipulate females' perceptions and increase their likelihood of choosing the builder as their mate. "This is a fascinating example of the complexity of animal behaviors," said James Ha, a cognitive behavior researcher at the University of Washington in Seattle. "I can't think of any other animal that clearly uses optical illusions." Contemplating the complex and intelligent design of the Creation should prompt us to exclaim: "O Lord, how great is the number of your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of the things you have made." (Psalm 104:24)


Last Chance to Get Recognized!

Question: Last Shabbos, we all stood up when we finished the Book of Exodus. What was that all about?

Answer: When the last sentence of each of the Five Books of the Torah is about to be read. everyone rises in anticipation of what is said by all at the end of the reading: Chazak, chazak v'nischazek -- Be strong, be strong, and may we be strengthened! This is a call of encouragement to continue with the reading of the next Book, and to return to this one in due course. The triple use of chazak may symbolize the past, present and future. The inspiration for saying these words in connection with finishing a section of the Torah may come from the Talmudic passage that "Four (elements) need to be strengthened: Torah, good deeds, prayer, and derech eretz (work)." source for being strengthened in Torah can be found in the Book of Joshua (1:7): "Only be strong (chazak) and very courageous, and observe to do according to all the Torah, which Moshe my servant commanded you." (from: To Pray as a Jew, Rabbi Donin)

Today is Shabbos HaChodesh

Sabbath of the "Month" - March 24

Shabbos HaChodesh is the Shabbos that occurs on or before the first day of the month of Nisan during which Passover is observed. We read an extra Torah portion, Exodus 12:1-20. which talks about preparations for Passover, which begins on Nissan 15. With one simple line, it establishes the Hebrew calendar: "This month shall be for you the beginning of the months, it shall be for you the first of the months of the year." In the Hebrew calendar, months are counted from Nisan in the spring, but years are counted from the month of Tishri in the fall. The corresponding haftarah portion is Ezekiel 45:16-46:18, which also talks about the first months and the offerings at that time.

The Great Sabbath - March 31

The Shabbos before Pesach commemorates the 10th day of Nissan, when the Hebrew slaves took the lambs that they were going to offer for Pesach and tied them up outside their homes, to keep until they offered them on the 14th. This was a very dangerous thing to do, because Egyptians worshipped sheep; but, miraculously, instead of slaughtering the Hebrews, the Egyptians instead fought with each other over whether the Hebrews should be sent away already. The special haftorah for this Shabbos is Malachi 3:4 - 3:24, which tells about the return of Elijah the prophet and coming of the Messiah. We believe that Elijah will return at Pesach, and that is why we include a cup of wine for him at the <u>seder</u>.
