



Beyond Twelve Gates by Rabbi Ze'ev Smason

Beyond Twelve Gates' refers to a beautiful concept taught by the great mystic *Rabbi Isaac Luria* (1534-1572), also known as *'The Ari'*. There exist twelve gates of prayer in Heaven — one for each tribe of Israel. There also exists a Heavenly thirteenth gate. Through this gate the prayers of all Jews, regardless of tribe, Jewish education or level of observance, are allowed to enter and are heard by G-d.

Welcome to Beyond Twelve Gates



Life has not always been wonderful for Dr. Gabriel Ethan Feldman. He has been bankrupt, unemployed and penniless. He has been forced to move back to his mother's house.

But Dr. Feldman has always had a strong sense of right and wrong, inculcated in him by his father, Irwin, a rabbi; his mother, Bernice, the daughter of a doctor who made \$2 house calls; and Frank Capra movies. His determination to do the right thing paid off earlier this month when under the federal whistle-blower law, he was awarded \$14.7 million from a \$70 million settlement in a Medicaid fraud case against New York City. Dr. Feldman and the Justice Department said New York was improperly assigning home health care.

"Movies like 'Mr. Smith Goes to Washington' made a very big impact on me," Dr. Feldman said. "That's why I came forward." He is a longtime do-gooder. As an undergraduate at Brandeis University, he handed out anti-smoking kits at parties. Dr. Feldman's mother, Bernice, said she was proud of her son. "He is just a wonderful person," Mrs. Feldman said. "My three sons, they are the soul of integrity." But she could not resist adding her hopes for her now richer son: "I hope he can find a Jewish wife who is caring and wonderful and observes Passover. If she observes Passover, then I don't have to ask any other questions."

Proverbs (10:9) says: "The man of integrity walks securely, but he who takes crooked paths will be found out." Ask Mrs. Feldman: Integrity is a priceless commodity.

<u> Parshas Vayeira – Genesis 18:1 – 21:24</u>



The parsha begins with Abraham's incredible display of chesed (kindness) to three angels who appear as men. This, despite his extreme discomfort from his recent bris milah (circumcision). The angels declare that Sarah

will give birth to her first child at the age of 90, when Abraham himself would be 100. Later, Abraham pleads to G-d on behalf of the cities of Sodom and Gemorrah. However, the cities are soon destroyed,

but not before the angels save Abraham's nephew Lot and his family from destruction.

Later the parsha describes how Sarah is abducted by Avimelech, the king of Gerar, who did not realize she was married. G-d responds by striking him with a plague which prevents him from touching her. Sarah conceives and gives birth to Isaac, and Abraham makes a huge celebration. Sarah sees Ishmael (Abraham's son from Hagar) as a menace to her own son's spiritual well-being and asks Abraham to expel Ishmael and Hagar. The Torah portion concludes with the Akeidah, Abraham's tenth and final test, in which he shows his willingness to comply with G-d's command to bring his beloved son Isaac as a sacrifice.

Rabbinic Ruminations



Time can "drag" and time can "fly." People strive to "save time" and then strive to "kill time." People complain of "having time on their hands," and "of not having a minute to themselves." The

mind can do funny things to our perception of time. Just ask French cave expert Michel Siffre.

In 1962 Siffre, whose work helped found the field of human chronobiology, went to live in a cave that was completely isolated from mechanical clocks and natural light. Sleeping and eating only when his body told him to, his goal was to discover how the natural rhythms of human life would be affected by living "beyond time." Siffre soon began to experience a huge change in his perception of time. It took him five minutes to count from 1 to 120. In Siffre's words, "I psychologically experienced five real minutes as though they were two." After emerging from the cave he guessed the trip had lasted 34 days. He'd actually been isolated for 59 days.

Our mistaken perceptions of the world around us derive from our subjective selves. Ask a person for assistance, and he may say he has no time. Again, ask him for a donation to a charitable cause, and perhaps he'll answer that he has no money, but will be glad to contribute his time! "Repent one day before your death," Ethics of the Fathers teaches. Does a person know which day he will die? All the more reason to repent today and live our lives
