Parshas Tzav

The portion begins with G-d continuing to teach Moses many of the laws relating to the Mishkan service. However, while last week's portion described the korbanos (offerings) from the perspective of the giver, this week the Torah focuses more directly on the Kohanim, providing details about their service. After first describing the maintenance of the fire which burned on the altar, the Torah discusses the various kinds of korbanos which Aaron, his sons, and the succeeding generations of Kohanim would be offering. The offerings must be brought with the proper intention and eaten in a state of spiritual purity. Finally, Moses performs the lengthy consecration service of the Mishkan, and anoints Aaron and his sons for their service in the Mishkan, in front of the entire congregation of Israel.

PUTIM'S IN Rear-VIEW MITTON! PESACH IS COMING!

Study vs. Action ~ Tzav (Leviticus 8:14-21)

The sacrifices that Moses offered up in order to install Aaron and his sons included ascent-offerings, sin-offerings, and peace-offerings.

ויקרא ח:יח) (ויקרא ח:יח) ויַּקְרֵב אֶת אֱיל הָעֹלָה וֹגוֹי:

[Moses] brought forth the ascent-ram. - Leviticus 8:18

The sages teach us that, in the absence of the holy Temple, someone who studies the laws of a given sacrifice is considered as if he had offered it up. But if the study of the laws of a sacrifice accomplishes the same thing as offering it up, why should we bother with the sacrifice itself, even when the Temple will be rebuilt?

The difference between the "virtual" sacrifice and the actual one is their effect on the world. While a sacrifice "offered up" by studying its laws elevates the person, it does not elevate the world around him. Only the physical sacrifice, which includes all aspects of creation – human, animal, vegetable, and mineral – elevates the world at large.

Thus, we should always seek a practical, tangible way to apply the spiritual inspiration or insight we garner, in order for it to affect and elevate not merely ourselves, but the entire world.
