Tisha B'Av, the 9th day of the month of Av, is the saddest day on the Jewish calendar, on which we fast and pray. It is the culmination of the Three Weeks, a period of time during which we mark the destruction of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem, and it is also the date that many other tragedies befell our people. The fast of Tisha B'Av begins at sunset of the previous evening. At ma'ariv (the evening service) we gather in the synagogue to read Eicha, the Book of Lamentations. Besides fasting, we abstain from additional pleasures: washing, applying lotions or creams, wearing leather shoes, and marital relations. Until midday, we sit on the floor or on low stools.

One may not eat or drink after 8:00 pm on Shabbos, Aug. 10 Fast ends: 8:43 P.M., Sunday, Aug. 11

Parshas Devarim

This week we begin the fifth and final book of the Torah, Deuteronomy. This book is also called Mishna Torah, "Repetition of the Torah" - thus the Greek title 'Deuteronomy.' Its contents were spoken by Moses to the Jewish people during the final five weeks of his life as the people prepared to

cross the Jordan River into the land of Israel. A central theme of Deuteronomy is Moses' review of the mitzvos, and his emphasis on the change of lifestyle the Jewish people were to undergo. The transition was to be made from a supernatural existence in the desert to a natural life to be experienced in the Land of Israel.

The portion begins with Moses' veiled rebuke in which he makes reference to the many sins and rebellions of the past forty years. Moses spends significant time discussing the failed mission of the spies; ten of the twelve men sent to scout out the land returned with a bad report, resulting in the entire nation wandering in the desert for forty years. Moses later discusses the Children of Israel's conquest on the eastern bank of the Jordan River. This Torah portion concludes with words of encouragement for Moses' successor, Joshua.

Shabbos Chazon

The Shabbos preceding the observance of the fast of the Ninth of Av is called *Shabbos Chazon*— "Shabbas of the Vision." This Shabbos' reading from the Prophets begins with the words *Chazon Yeshayahu*, the "vision of Isaiah" regarding the destruction of the Holy Temple. The legendary chassidic master Rabbi Levi Yitzchak of Berditchev said that on this special Shabbos, every Jewish soul is shown a vision of the third Holy Temple. The purpose of this vision is to arouse within every Jew a yearning to actually see this edifice which will be built by G-d, and to do as many mitzvos as possible in order to realize this dream. While this vision may not be sensed with the physical eyes, the soul certainly experiences this vision, and it affects the person on the subconscious level.

There is no mourning on Shabbos, and eating meat and drinking wine is permissible. Though the observance of Tisha B'av begins on Motzei Shabbos (Saturday night), one should neither eat nor drink after 8:00 P.M. on Shabbos, Aug. 11.

Tish'a B'Av / תשעה באב

Tisha B'Av (Hebrew: ט׳ באב זס תשעה באב, "the Ninth of Av,") is an annual fast day in Judaism, named for the ninth day (Tisha) of the month of Av in the Hebrew calendar. The fast commemorates the destruction of both the First Temple and Second Temple in Jerusalem, which occurred hundreds of years apart, but on the same Hebrew calendar date. Tisha B'Av is never observed on Shabbat. This year the fast is postponed and Tish'a B'Av begins at sundown on Saturday, August 10.

What Happened on Tisha B'Av?

In Torah times, the spies returned from the Promised Land with frightening reports, and the Israelites balked at the prospect of entering the land. G d decreed that they would therefore wander in the desert for 40 years.

Both Holy Temples in Jerusalem were destroyed on this date. The First Temple was burned by the Babylonians and the Second Temple fell to the Romans, unleashing a period of suffering from which our nation has never fully recovered.

The Bar Kochba revolt against the Romans in ended in defeat: The Jews of Betar were butchered on the 9th of Av and the Temple Mount was plowed one year later on the same date.

Later on in our history, many more tragedies happened on this day, including the 1290 expulsion of England's Jews and the 1492 banishment of all Jews from Spain.
