Parshas Yisro

The weekly portion begins with Moses' father-in-law, Yisro, arriving at the Jewish people's camp in the desert, where he is greeted warmly by a large entourage. Yisro was inspired to join them when he heard about all of the wonders and miracles which G-d performed for the Jewish people during the Exodus



from Egypt. Upon witnessing Moses serving as the people's sole judge from dawn until dusk, Yisro declares that this system will never work. He therefore suggests that subordinate judges be appointed to adjudicate the smaller cases. Moses agrees to this plan. The Jewish people arrive at Mt. Sinai and prepare to receive the Torah. Moses ascends the mountain and G-d tells him to convey to the people that they will be to Him a treasure from among the nations. After three days of preparation the moment of revelation finally arrives. Amid thunder, lightning and the sound of the shofar, G-d descends upon the mountain and proclaims -- with the entire Jewish people listening -- the Ten Commandments. Referred to in Hebrew as the Aseres HaDibros, a more accurate translation would be the Ten Sayings or the Ten Statements. One noteworthy feature of the revelation is that both before and since Sinai, no nation has ever made the claim that G-d spoke to an entire nation of millions of individuals. Moses then ascends the mountain to receive the remainder of the Torah from G-d, both the written and oral segments. The portion concludes with several mitzvos concerning the construction of the altar in the Temple.

Torah Trivia from the Parsha this week:

Last week's question: What exceptional item did Moshe take with him from Mitzrayim?

Answer is: The bones of Yoseph. Because Yoseph made his brothers swear that when they left Mitzrayim they would take his bones with them.

This week's question: What were the names of Moshe's wife and sons?



Parshas Yitro

The Importance of Simple Things

-Translated and Adapted by Moshe Wisnefsky from Lubavitcher Rebbe (Chabad.org)

You must not ascend My altar on steps, so that your
nakedness not be exposed over it. - (Exodus 20:23)

The priests wore trousers under their tunics, so their bodies would not have been exposed to the altar even on a staircase. Nonetheless, since walking up a staircase gives the impression of exposing one's uncovered body, it is more modest to use a ramp. If G-d requires us to respect the "feelings" of unfeeling stones, all the more so does He require us to respect the feelings of our fellow human beings.


The requirement to show respect to the stones of the altar teaches us to safeguard the honor of other people even when they are not aware that they are being disrespected, even when we do not mean to offend them.

Thus, this last verse of this section of the Torah sums up the message of G-d's revelation at Mount Sinai: G-d is found in even the most mundane things. Our relationships with other people are part and parcel of our relationship with G-d. And in a positive sense, loving other people is in truth loving our Creator.


