#### Parshas Terumah / Zachor

Parshas Terumah begins a series of four out of five portions which discuss in detail the construction of the Mishkan, the traveling Tabernacle which would serve as a 'resting place' for G-d's presence among the Jewish people. This week's portion recounts G-d's description to Moses of how to construct the Mishkan, beginning with a listing of the various

precious materials to be collected from the Jewish people for this monumental project. G-d describes the magnificent golden and wooden Ark which would house the tablets of the Ten Commandments, complete with its dazzling cover depicting two cherubim (angels with faces of children) facing each other. Next, G-d provides Moses with the blueprints of the shulchan (holy table) upon which the lechem hapanim (showbread) would be placed each week. Following the description of the pure golden menorah which was to be hammered from one large piece of gold, G-d describes the structure of the Mishkan itself. It contained splendidly woven and embroidered covers, curtains and partitions, and the sturdy outer walls. The Torah portion concludes with instructions for the copper altar and the Mishkan's large outer courtyard.

This Shabbos we have a special, additional Torah reading, Parshas Zachor. That text (Devarim, 25: 17-19) teaches us the mitzva to remember to wipe out Amalek.

### Shabbos / PURIM

Dear Members and Friends,

I am pleased to inform you that based upon guidance from our medical advisors, we recently began able to accommodate a total of twenty (20) individuals at Shabbos morning services. On Shabbos mornings we will also begin the use of a brief health-screening questionnaire card with a fold-down tab. Upon entry to the shul, each person will be presented with a card to affirm the questions on the screening form.

With Purim around the corner, we are looking forward to a joyous and meaningful Purim. I'm also pleased to inform you that based upon guidance from our medical advisors we will be able to accommodate a total of thirty (30) NHBZ members for each of the Megillah readings. A Megillah reading will take place on Thursday evening, February 26 and Friday morning, February 27. For those wanting to attend our Megillah readings, reservations are a MUST.

Please contact Jeff Miller at <a href="mailto:jeff@nhbz.org">jeff@nhbz.org</a> or at 314 991-2100 x 2 to let him know if you would like to attend the evening and / or morning Megillah readings. The reservation deadline is Tuesday, February 23 at 5:00 P.M. We will also have a brief health-screening questionnaire at both of the Purim Megillah-reading services.

We do hope to accommodate all those interested in attending our Megillah readings. In the event that more than 30 individuals pre-register for a Megillah reading, a random selection will be made to determine those who can attend. In the event any members might be unable to attend a Megillah reading due to capacity restrictions, those members will have first priority to attend our other Megillah reading.

Regarding children under the age of 13 (boys) and 12 (girls), we must ask that they be registered only as 'alternates' in the event we do not have 30 registrations for our Megillah readings. Since hearing the Megillah on Purim is a halachic obligation for adults, any adult NHBZ member will have first priority to attend.

We also plan to broadcast both of our Megillah readings by Zoom. If an individual is unable to attend a live Megillah reading, he or she can rely upon the opinion that one can fulfill the mitzvah of hearing the Megillah read by Zoom.

The Purim Seudah (festive meal) can be fulfilled in the morning (Friday), but in any event should be completed by 2:30 P.M. Regarding the mitzvah of Mishloach Manos (gifts of food), one can fulfill the mitzvah by leaving a Mishloach Manos package on a person's porch if it is a safe and secure area and the recipient will receive it on Purim provided that the recipient is made aware of the identity of the giver

Please keep in mind that the mitzvah of Mishloach Manos only requires the delivery of two separate food or drink items to one person. Therefore, although in most years it is considered praiseworthy to give Mishloach Manos to many people during this year one may rely upon fulfillment of the essential mitzvah to give Mishloach Manos to one individual.

Matanos L'Evyonim (Tzedaka on Purim Day) can be given in advance to those who will be distributing gifts to the poor on Purim from Matanos L'Evyonim funds. As in past years, I will be distributing Matanos L'Evyonim both locally and through the worthy organization of Od Yosef Chai. If you would like me to be your proxy to distribute Matanos L'Evyonim, please make sure your check arrives at the synagogue no later than Wednesday, February 24. The check should be made out to 'The Rabbi's Fund' with a notation 'for Purim Tzedaka.

Parshas Zachor will be read at shul on Shabbos, February 20. For those not able to attend, hopefully we will all be able to be in shul this summer to listen to Parshas Zachor again at the conclusion of Parshas Ki Teitzei (8/21/2021), at which point someone who did not previously hear it live should have in mind to fulfill the obligation again at that time.

#### MINYAN PRAYER IS A MITZVAH

Shalom,

Our shul is first and foremost our house of prayer, teffilah. We are obligated to daven thrice daily, come rain, shine, hail, snow.

Minyan praying facilitates many prayers which can only be uttered as a congregation. Those include the reading of Torah, the stating of Barchu, the saying of Kedusha and of course, the Kaddish.

Lacking a minyan, we void ourselves of fulfilling these mitzvot.

All should know that since the beginning of COVID-19 conditions, our shul has continued to hold daily and Shabbat and yom tov minyanim, with almost no interruptions. These are conducted within the current medical parameters.

We thank our group of very dedicated men, who have made this possible and those ladies who come on shabbat.

There are various reasons put forward for not attending minyan, including the current COVID-19 situation. Recently, they excavated a hiding room in what was the Warsaw ghetto. They found 10 sets of teffilin, leading to the easy conclusion that those hiding there were conducting regular minyanim, under the human-devil conditions of the Nazis.

If those Yidden were prepared to risk their lives on a daily basis to fulfill the mitzvah of teffila b'tzibur (public prayer), surely, we can participate in responsibly conducted minyanim.


