

Parshas Vayikra

This Shabbos marks the beginning of our reading the third book of the Torah, Sefer Vayikra which deals primarily with the services and responsibilities of the Kohanim. This week's portion focuses on many of the korbanos (offerings) to be brought in the newly-constructed Mishkan. Parshas Vayikra begins with G-d calling Moses into the Mishkan where he will receive many relevant mitzvos to be ultimately passed on to the Jewish people. The first half of the Torah portion describes the various optional korbanos brought by individuals. They can be classified into three general categories, each one comprised of several gradations in size and expense; the korban olah (elevation offering) which is completely consumed on the altar; the korban mincha (meal offering) which, because of its inexpensive contents is usually brought by someone of modest means; and the korban shelamim (peace offering) partially burned on the altar, with the remainder divided between the owners and the Kohanim. The second half of the portion (beginning with chapter four) discusses the required chatos (sin) and asham (guilt) offerings to be brought as atonement for unintentional transgressions.

Hagolah: Dipping in **Boiling Water**



Hagolah is used for items such as silverware, pots, silver kiddush cups.


- Never stick your hands into a pot of boiling water.
- Never leave a pot of boiling water unattended.
- Never allow children near a pot of boiling water.

Iruy: Pouring Boiling Water

Iruy is used for counters and sinks.

- One should not boil water in foil pans or other containers that are not specifically made for boiling water.
- Easiest and safest to use a tea kettle to pour water on each part of the surface.
- Be cautious about where the poured water will go once poured.
- Ensure you are wearing safe apparel, including waterproof apron and shoes.
- Use gloves that are heat-resistant and waterproof. 00 00 00

Oven Kashering



- Ensure area is properly ventilated
- Keep chemicals out of reach of children
- Never leave oven unattended during koshering (high temperatures)
- Never allow children to play near an oven that is on
- Do not use a blow torch unless you are trained to do so
- There is potential risk of fire during the self-clean process, especially if there is a build-up of grease on the bottom of the oven
- If placing foil over the oven backsplash, do not cover oven vent.

Selling Chametz Pesach 2021

Dear Members and Friends,

The challenging situation of the Covid-19 requires a modification in the way we will be able to sell our chametz this year. Unlike previous years where you could personally meet with Rabbi Smason and then designate him as your *shliach* (proxy) to sell your chametz, current circumstances require the chametz sale to be conducted by email or regular (snail) mail.

Below, please find a form authorizing Rabbi Smason to be your *shliach* (proxy) to sell your chametz for Pesach, this year to begin on the evening of March 27 and conclude on the evening of April 4.

Your authorization form MUST be in Rabbi Smason's possession no later than 3:00 P.M. Thursday, March 26. If you plan on sending the form by regular mail, please allow sufficient time for its arrival to the NHBZ office no later than Wednesday, March 25.

It is customary to offer an honorarium the Rabbi for this service. If you choose to do so, then payments should be made by cash or by check directly to Rabbi Smason.

I / We appoint Rabbi Ze'ev Smason to be my/our agent in regard to the sale of <i>CHAMETZ</i> prior to Passover, and subsequent re-purchase after Passover, if possible. This agency is bound by the dictates of <i>Halacha</i> and all necessary qualifications to ensure that this agency and sales, purchases and rentals enacted thereby meet these requirements are deemed to be part of this agreement.
Reference is made to the standard <i>SHTAR HARSHA'AH</i> in this regard. Included in this agency is the right to appoint further agents and to rent/sell real and personal property as need be to ensure that the <i>HALACHIC</i> concerns in regard to <i>chametz</i> on Passover are met.

As a way of remembering it is important not to forget how the human race has allowed injustice and depravation to target specific ethnic or religious peoples. If we look back into our own past, it is possible to find that such discrimination has come into our lives or the lives of our families.

Julie Kohner is the daughter of a Holocaust survivor. In 1990 she created *Voices of the Generations* as a way to preserve and share the memories of Holocaust survivor stories. Julie's mother, Hanna Kohner, survived four concentration camps including Auschwitz. She passed away in 1990.

Since then it has been Julie's passion to tell her mother's unique story of love overcoming evil against the backdrop of World War II Europe. Her experience was also the basis for an early 1950's television program, the first to tell a survivor's story.

Julie hopes that people of all ages, ethnic and religious backgrounds will be moved and inspired by her mother's story and the stories of other survivors and their children, known as second generation. This will keep the memory alive.

Voices of the Generations, Inc. is a non-profit organization with a mission to bear witness as a second generation. In as little as ten years there may no longer be a Holocaust survivor to share their stories in person.
