Purim commemorates the salvation of the Jewish people in Ancient Persia from Haman's plot to kill all Jews in a single day. Set in Persia 2,300 years ago, the "Megillah" tells how a seemingly unrelated series of events spun together to save the Jewish people from annihilation. Purim is Judaism's most dramatic, fun-filled holiday. Here are the mitzvot and customs of Purim at NHBZ:

1. Read the Book of Esther - Mitzvah of Mikra Megillah
It is a Mitzvah to hear the Megillah read twice. Bring your kids and family!

With the festive holiday of Purim fast approaching, I'm writing to remind you of the time-sensitive mitzvah of *Matanos L'Evyonim* -- tzedaka (charity) to the poor. For many years, we at NHBZ have collected *Matanos L'Evyonim* in conjunction with the worthy organization *Od Yosef Chai*. NHBZ Updated COVID Policy

Dear Members and Friends,

With thanks to HaShem, the current situation in the St. Louis County area now allows some relaxation of our health-protection protocols. Beginning on Purim (March 16, Wednesday evening) we at NHBZ can transition to a "Mask-Recommended" policy.

- 1) For those congregants who wish to mask, a surgical, KN95 or N95 mask is recommended.
- 2) With masking being optional, it is imperative that congregants be responsible for and to each other. If a congregant has a known recent exposure or even marginal symptoms, it is important that they follow CDC guidelines with respect to quarantining or isolating and testing. The same goes for any congregants testing positive.
- 3) Masking of concerned or at-risk congregants is welcomed, and those choosing to mask should be treated respectfully. A 'masking-only' area in both the men's and women's section will be set aside for tefila / prayer services on Purim and Shabbos.
- 4) Children aged 12 and older have the same requirements as adults. Children under age 12 who are not vaccinated must wear a mask; under age 3 no mask needed.
- 5) Participation in indoor tefila / prayer services and programs will continue to require proof of vaccination be shown for those members and guests who haven't already done so through Rabbi Smason.
- 6) As always, we will continue to monitor health and safety related issues closely. In consultation with our shul's medical advisors, policies may change as circumstances dictate.

Ask Our Rabbis

Q. May I listen to a recorded reading of Megillas Esther this Purim to fulfill my obligation to hear the Megillah as opposed to attending a live reading?

A. The Shulchan Aruch (OC 690:18) says that one should listen to the Megillah reading in the presence of a Minyan, although one will fulfill the Mitzvah when reading the Megillah alone from a proper scroll. This reflects the concept that B'rov Am Hadras Melech- In multitudes there is glorification of the king (Mishlei 14:28), which means that Hashem is glorified more when Jews come together to perform a Mitzvah.

The Poskim discuss whether one will fulfill this Mitzvah if he hears it through a microphone. Although it is beyond the scope of this column to fully discuss the issue, the consensus among modern Halachic authorities is that using a microphone is not ideal, and as a last resort one would be able to listen over the phone/Zoom when no other options are available. This presumes that the listener is hearing the Megillah being read in real time, as the Chazon Ish indicates that the issue with hearing a recording is that the listener isn't participating in the live MItzvah being performed. In sum, participating in the Megillah reading at your local Orthodox synagogue (NHBZ) is the ideal way to fulfill the Mitzvah of hearing the Megillah.

Learning at NHBZ

Parshas Vayikra / Zachor – By Rabbi Smason

This Shabbos marks the beginning of our reading the third book of the Torah, Sefer Vayikra which deals primarily with the services and responsibilities of the Kohanim. This week's portion focuses on many of the korbanos (offerings) to be brought in the newly-constructed Mishkan. Parshas Vayikra begins with G-d calling Moses into the Mishkan where he will receive many relevant mitzvos to be ultimately passed on to the Jewish people. The first half of the Torah portion describes the various optional korbanos brought by individuals. They can be classified into three general categories, each one comprised of several gradations in size and expense; the *korban olah* (elevation offering) which is completely consumed on the altar; the *korban mincha* (meal offering) which, because of its inexpensive contents is usually brought by someone of modest means; and the *korban shelamim* (peace offering) partially burned on the altar, with the remainder divided between the owners and the Kohanim. The second half of the portion (beginning with chapter four) discusses the required *chatos* (sin) and *asham* (guilt) offerings to be brought as atonement for unintentional transgressions.

This Shabbos we have a special, additional Torah reading, Parshas Zachor. That text (Devarim, 25: 17-19) teaches us the mitzva to remember to wipe out Amalek.








Book Club News

A Stiff-Necked People

...Not by accident does the main narrative of the Book of Esther begin with the words "And Mordechai would not bow down" (Esther 3:1). His refusal to make obeisance to Haman sets the story in motion. Mordechai too is obstinate – for there is one thing that is hard to do if you have a stiff neck, namely, bow down. At times, Jews found it hard to bow down to G-d – but they were certainly never willing to bow down to anything less. That is why, alone of all the many peoples who have entered the arena of history, Jews – even in exile, dispersed, and everywhere a minority – neither assimilated to the dominant culture nor converted to the majority faith.

"Forgive them *because* they are a stiff-necked people," said Moses, because the time will come when that stubbornness will be not a tragic failing but a noble and defiant loyalty. And so it came to be.
