Selling Chametz – Pesach 2023/5783

Dear Members and Friends,

We are pleased to offer three methods to designate Rabbi Chaim Bogopulsky as your *shliach* (proxy) to sell your chametz this year: you may personally meet with Rabbi Bogopulsky, email an authorization form, or send by regular (USPS) mail. Please note that the preferred method is to meet with the Rabbi in person. The Rabbi will be available this coming week, after evening minyan Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. He will also be available at other times by appointment. Those who are unable to make it to Shul may contact the Rabbi to schedule a house visit.

Below is a sample form authorizing Rabbi Bogopulsky to be your *shliach* for Pesach this year, to begin on the evening of April 5 and conclude on the evening of April 13, 2023.

Your authorization form MUST be in Rabbi Bogopulsky's possession no later than 3:00 P.M. Tuesday, April 4. If you plan on sending the form by regular ("snail") mail, please allow sufficient time for its arrival to the NHBZ office no later than Friday, March 31.

It is customary to offer an honorarium to the Rabbi for this service. If you choose to do so, then payments should be made by cash or by check directly to Rabbi Chaim Bogopulsky.

If you have any questions about the process of the sale of chametz, or to schedule an appointment please contact Rabbi Bogopulsky by email (rabbibogopulsky@nhbz.org) or phone (845-642-6758). Please do not wait until the last minute.

<u>Learning at NHBZ</u>

Parashas Vayak'hel

Vayak'hel begins with Moses assembling the entire nation of Israel to transmit the details of the construction and fabrication of the Mishkan as described in the three previous Torah portions. However, Moses first cautions them about the fundamental mitzvah to observe Shabbat. The nation is reminded that although the construction of the Mishkan is of transcendent importance, it does not take precedence over the weekly observance of Shabbat. The portion describes that the Jewish people came forward with their generous contributions for the Mishkan's construction, producing a surplus of supplies. The craftsmen are selected and the building begins.

Parashas Pekudei

This week we read the final portion of Exodus, a book which began with the Jewish people enslaved to Pharaoh in Egypt and now ends with the completion of the construction of the Mishkan in the desert. Exodus is known as 'The Book of Redemption'; redemption was achieved not only through our escape from slavery, but also through receiving the Torah on Mt. Sinai which gave purpose to that freedom. The climax of that salvation was when G-d rested His presence among the Jewish nation when the Mishkan was completed.

Parshas Pekudei begins with a complete accounting of the gold, silver and copper contributed by the people for use in the Mishkan. Following an inspection and approval of the many utensils and unassembled parts, Moses sets up the Mishkan on Rosh Chodesh Nissan as each part is anointed and arranged in its proper location. When the Mishkan is finally complete with every vessel in place, a cloud descends upon it, indicating that G-d's glory was resting there. Whenever the cloud moved away from the Mishkan, the Jewish people would follow it. At night the cloud was replaced by a pillar of fire.

Parashas HaChodesh

Shabbos HaChodesh ("Sabbath [of the] month" שבת החודש) precedes the first of the Hebrew month of Nisan during which Pesach is celebrated (this Shabbos is Rosh Chodesh Nisan). Exodus 12:1-20 and the laws of Pesach are read as the maftir aliyah, along with a special haftorah. On the first day of Nisan, Hashem presented the first commandment of how to "sanctify the new moon" (kiddush hachodesh) for the onset of Rosh Chodesh and thus Nisan becomes the first month of the Jewish year (counting by months). This special reading helps to prepare us for Pesach.

The Jewish Mother: Wisdom of the Heart

"And every wise hearted woman spun with her hands, and they brought spun material: blue, purple and crimson wool, and linen ..." -Exodus 35:25

...There are literally thousands of stories, liberally sprinkled throughout the course of Jewish history, of Jewish mothers who selflessly sacrificed for the sake of their children with no regard to personal safety... What is the source of their strength? It is their faith. From the very beginning, Jewish women believed in a personal and caring G-d. When Jewish men despaired, Jewish women believed and carried on. When the future seemed bleak, when events seemed at their worst, the women never lost hope. They never broke faith. They always believed that G-d would come through. If not immediately, then soon. If not for them, then for their children.

Our mothers give us the foundation upon which we build. Foundations are not usually visible and aren't meant to be. They are concealed by the buildings atop them. But at times of turmoil, when the building crumbles, the foundation can once again be glimpsed. Its solid surface cannot be shaken. The entire building can be rebuilt upon it.

This is why the Torah identifies the women who helped to build the tabernacle as "wise of heart." Wisdom of heart pertains to immutable faith and insurmountable strength. Indeed, these were the builders of our tabernacle. These were the true founders of our nation.

Moses, Aaron, the rabbis, judges, teachers and priests all did their parts. Master builders constructed the tabernacle and gifted architects sketched its plans. But it would all have come to naught if not for the contribution of "wise of heart," the Jewish mothers. These wise women planted the seeds that blossomed into a nation. These wise women sowed kernels of faith and reaped generations of fortitude.
