



EMOR ★ Todah: Showing Gratitude

We generally don't really appreciate that which we have until it looks like there's a risk of losing it. There is a special blessing we say after surviving danger, illness, or another perilous situation. We come to the synagogue to say a blessing of gratitude at the Torah. We make this public affirmation of thanks because when you've nearly lost everything, you know how much you have to be grateful for, and you wish to openly show your appreciation to G-d for His gifts and miracles. In Temple times, the person offering a korban todah would also bring 40 large loaves of bread to the Temple to be eaten on that day; leaving no leftovers. Since no one person or family could eat it all, it's as if the Torah is forcing you to share your simchas with the community—to all sit together—rejoicing in G-d's blessings and recounting the story of your
