#### Parshas Lech Lecha

Parshas Lech Lecha (and Vayeira and part of Chaya Sarah) is not JUST an inside look at Avraham Avinu's diary. We are not supposed to read what happened in his life, and that's it. There is an interesting 14-year gap in Avraham's life recorded in next week's sedra. The Torah tells us that Avraham was 86 years old when Yishmael was born. The very next pasuk tells us that he was 99 years old. Are you curious about what happened to Avraham and Sarah when they were 90 and 80 years old respectively? We don't know. Neither the Torah nor any other of our sources tells us because it doesn't make any difference to us what happened to them then. The Torah tells us only that which is to be instructive to us in our lives as Jews. The Torah tells us about G-d's command to Avraham to circumcise himself because Bris Milah is incumbent upon us, and because we are to be inspired by the Torah's words to the high dedication and commitment towards that mitzvah and all of Torah that was part of Avraham Avinu's life.

We learn such beautiful lessons from Avraham and Sara - about hospitality, about chesed, about prayer ...

WHAT ABOUT ERETZ YISRAEL? What lesson do we - should we - learn about the importance, the significance, the centrality of Eretz Yisrael to Jewish Life? Can a Torahreading-Torah-observant Jew read about G-d's sending Avraham to the land "He will show him", about G-d's repeated promises of the Land to Avraham's descendants, of the blessings that are associated with Avraham's going to the Land, and NOT get the point? Hear the message. Understand what G-d is telling each of us.

G-d says to Avraham and to each and every one of us, his children, that the Land of Israel is ours forever. Then He says it again and again and again. How come some Jews don't listen to what G-d says? (I'm not talking about those who don't listen to a lot of other things that G-d says. I'm talking about people who listen when He talks about Shabbos and Kashrus, and most other things, but somehow seem to have selective hearing.)

G-d told Avraham to go to the Land. That he would be blessed there. Why are there Jews, otherwise observant and religious, who don't think that G-d was also talking to them? (And again, I'm not talking about Jews who don't come on Aliyah for a variety of reasons, both solid and less so. I'm talking about those who have removed Aliyah from their religious agendas and from their hearts.)

It might be naive to think that our problems in Israel and the world will go away if and when more and more Jews make Aliyah, but what's wrong with naive? We've got two major challenges: Increase Torah study, observance and commitment among all of the Jewish People, wherever they are; and bring the Jewish People back to Eretz Yisrael. We are no longer in required Galut. It is no longer impossible (was it ever?) or even too difficult to live in Eretz Yisrael. A Jew who commits himself to Torah and to living in Eretz Yisrael becomes a true heir and descendant of Avraham Avinu.

#### **Chronology of the Flood in History**


- Cheshvan 17: Beginning of the Mabul (Flood); Noah enters ark; rains begin.
- Kislev 27: Forty days of rain end; beginning of 150 days of water's swelling and churning.
- Sivan 1: Water calms and begins to subside.
- **Sivan 17**: The bottom of the ark touches down on the top of the mountains of Ararat.
- Av 1: The mountain peaks break the water's surface.
- Elul 10 (late summer): Noah opens the ark's window and dispatches a raven.
- Elul 17: Noah sends the dove the first time.
- Elul 23: The dove is sent a second time and returns with an olive leaf in its beak.
- Tishrei 1: Dove's third mission. Water completely drained.
- Cheshvan 27: Ground fully dried. Noah exits the ark.

### **LECH LECHA: Leaving the Garbage Behind**

And G-d said to Avram, go for yourself from your land, from your relatives, and from your father's house to the land that I will show you. (Gen. 12:1)

The Torah portion begins with Avraham's first trial: to give up his entire past and follow G-d's lead to a new land: G-d said to Avram, "Go for yourself from your land, from your relatives, and from your father's house to the land that I will show you." When a person leaves his hometown, he first leaves his father's house, then his neighborhood (his relatives), and then his country. Why does the verse list these in the opposite order?

When a person makes a physical departure, he first leaves his father's house, then his relatives, and then his country. However, the verse is alluding to Avraham's departure in a spiritual sense. "Leaving your hometown" means changing your old ways and leaving behind your bad habits. Therefore, the order in the verse is reversed, starting with the easier things. The culture of a person's country is not so deeply ingrained, and so it can be uprooted relatively easily. More difficult is to get rid of bad habits a person acquired amongst his social circle and friends. Finally, to shake off bad traits acquired at home is very challenging.

The Sfas Emes quotes the Zohar, which states that G-d called out "Go for yourself," in every generation, but Avraham was the only one to respond to G-d's call. G-d still calls out "go for yourself" today, and we need to respond. We must distance ourselves from bad habits and serve G-d even though it may require inconvenience or hardship.



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
